

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 19-0158R for form and legal sufficiency. The resolution is required under State law for the holder of a B-D-7 liquor license to exchange it for an A-7 license.

The license exchange contemplated by this resolution is authorized by Sec. 12-902.1 of the Md. Ann. Code, Alcoholic Beverage Art. Under this section, an application for a transfer can be approved if the following criteria are met:

1. the B-D-7 license must have been issued before July 1, 2018; and

2. the holder of the B-D-7 license must first obtains approval for the exchange by resolution of the Baltimore City Council;

The law also authorizes exchanges of B-D-& licenses for A-7 licenses in the 46th Legislative District.

Provided that the B-D-7 license for 1503-05 Light St. was issued prior to July 1, 2018, resolution 19-158R is appropriate to approve the exchange for an A-7 license.



<u>COMMENTS</u> – Council Resolution 19-0158R calls for the approval of the formal exchange of an existing Class B-D-7 License for a Class A-7 License at 1503-05 Light Street. Class B-D-7 Licenses are technically reserved for taverns where consumption of alcoholic beverages generally occur on location. Class A-7 Licenses are more appropriate for establishments that sell alcoholic beverages that are to be consumed off premises. Considering that the current business at 1503-05 Light Street appears to operate as more of a packaged goods store rather than a traditional tavern, the proposed license exchange serves to provide a more accurate license classification in terms of regulatory compliance.

The Baltimore City Department of Transportation does not foresee any direct operational of fiscal impacts associated with the passage this resolution.

<u>AGENCY/DEPARTMENT POSITION</u> - The Department of Transportation has **no objection** to City Council Resolution 19-0158R.



Background

The passage of Senate Bill 519, Baltimore City-Alcoholic Beverages-Class A-7 License, in the 2018 Maryland General Assembly session authorized the Baltimore City Board of License Commissioners to issue a Class A-7 license. A Class A-7 License authorizes the sale of beer, wine, and liquor from 9:00am to 10:00pm Monday through Sunday and prohibits on-site consumption. The current license for 1503-05 Light Street, Class B-D-7, authorizes the sale of beer, wine, and liquor for on- and off-premises consumption from 6:00am to 2:00am.

Fiscal Impact


The annual license fee for an A-7 license is \$1,500, compared to \$1,320 for a Class B-D-7 License. The City will receive an additional \$180 from this license change. While the license change reduces hours of operation, the City does not receive sales revenue from these purchases.

Conclusion

This bill approves the exchange of a Class B-D-7 License to a Class A-7 License for 1503-05 Light Street, as authorized by the Maryland General Assembly. There is minimal fiscal impact of this license change.

For the reasons stated above, the Department of Finance does not oppose City Council Bill 19-0158R.

I write to you today concerning City Council Bill 19-0158R, which was introduced by Councilman Eric Costello. If adopted this resolution would allow for the holder of a Class BD7 Beer, Wine, and Liquor (BWL) license located at 1503-05 Light Street to apply to the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City (BLLC) to exchange said license for a Class A-7 BWL License.

In 2018 the Maryland General Assembly (MGA) passed SB519, which allowed Class BD7 BWL license holders to exchange their licenses for a Class A-7 BWL license contingent upon passage of a City Council Resolution in support of the exchange. Only the holders of a Class BD7 BWL license prior to July 1, 2018 are eligible for such an exchange. In addition, the Board may not issue a Class A-7 BWL license after July 1, 2020.

The Class A-7 BWL license authorizes its holder to sell Beer, Wine, and Liquor at retail for off-premise consumption from 9:00 am to 10:00 pm 7-days per week. In 2019, the MGA passed HB637, which – effective July 1, 2019 – eliminated the prohibition on Class BD7 BWL license holders not located within a Planned Unit Development (PUD) in the 46th Legislative District from exchanging their licenses.

As such, Alc. Bev. Art. 12-902(c)(1), now allows the current holder of the Class BD7 BWL license located at 1503-05 Light Street (this property is not located in a PUD) to exchange their license for a Class A-7 BWL license, contingent on the adoption of Council Bill 19-015R. The BLLC has no objections to the adoption of this resolution.





Jen's Place, located at 1503 Light Street, would like to convert their B-D-7 liquor license to an A-7 liquor license utilizing the authority given in SB 519 which was passed last year by the Maryland General Assembly. The Riverside Neighborhood Association supports this request.

On May 8, 2018 Governor Hogan signed SB 519 into law. This bill authorizes "the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore City to issue a Class A-7 beer, wine, and liquor license which authorizes the holder to sell alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption at certain times; providing that license holders who hold a certain class of license are eligible to exchange that license for a Class A-7 license under certain circumstances; specifying that in the 46th legislative district a Class B-D-7 license may be exchanged for a Class A-7 license only under certain circumstances."

Jung Baik owns the B-D-7 liquor license utilized at 1503 Light Street. She told me she wants to convert this license to an A-7 license, and requested that the Riverside Neighborhood Association support this request. In addition, on Monday, January 28, 2019 Damian Park, Ms. Baik's spouse, presented this plan at our monthly neighborhood meeting. Finally, I have conferred with Thomas Akras, Deputy Executive Secretary for the Board of Liquor License Commissioners of the City of Baltimore, in an email exchange dated February 5, 2019 where he noted that this conversion "will not result in two licenses."

In summary, the Riverside Neighborhood Association supports a Baltimore City Council resolution supporting this liquor license conversion.




