27 28	(I) UPON ITS PASSAGE, THE REDISTRICTING PLAN RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL SHALL TAKE EFFECT.
29 30	(II) THE MAYOR MAY NOT VETO THE REDISTRICTING PLAN RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL.
31	(5) BOUNDARIES TO REMAIN IN EFFECT.
32 33	THE ADOPTED COUNCIL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT FOR THE ENTIRETY OF A REGULAR CITY COUNCIL SESSION.

4 5	The Mayor may not veto a redistricting plan resolution of the Mayor and City Council passed under Article III, $\S7(B)$ of this Charter.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</b> , That this proposed amendment to the City Charter be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City, for adoption or rejection, in accordance with Article XI-A, § 5 of the Maryland Constitution, in the form specified by the City Solicitor.
