AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

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**City Streets – Closing –
Eutaw Street**

3 FOR the purpose of condemning and closing Eutaw Street, extending from Pratt Street southerly
4 to Camden Street, as shown on Plat 347-A-69A in the Office of the Department of Public
5 Works; and providing for a special effective date.

14 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the
15 Department of Public Works shall proceed to condemn and close Eutaw Street, extending from
16 Pratt Street southerly to Camden Street, and more particularly described as follows:

17 Beginning for Parcel No.1 at the point formed by the intersection of the south side
18 of Pratt Street, 56 feet wide and the west side of Eutaw Street, 84 feet wide, and
19 running thence binding on the south side of said Pratt Street, Easterly, 84.0 feet to
20 intersect the east side of said Eutaw Street; thence binding on the east side of said
21 Eutaw Street, Southerly 323.3 feet, more or less, to intersect the north side of
22 Camden Street, 61 feet wide; thence binding on north side of said Camden Street,
23 Westerly 84.0 feet to intersect the west side of said Eutaw Street, and thence
24 binding on the west side of said Eutaw Street, Northerly 323.6 feet, more or less,
25 to the place of beginning.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law.
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.
Underlining indicates matter added to the bill by amendment.

2 13, 2005, in the Office of the Department of Public Works.

3 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the proceedings for the condemnation and
4 closing of Eutaw Street and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in
5 accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and
6 regulations adopted by the Director of Public Works and filed with the Department of
7 Legislative Reference.

8 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That after the closing under this Ordinance, all
9 subsurface structures and appurtenances now owned by the Mayor and City Council of
10 Baltimore continue to be the property of the Mayor and City Council, in fee simple, until their
11 use has been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council. If any person wants to remove, alter, or
12 interfere with them, that person must first obtain permission from the Mayor and City Council
13 and, in the application for this permission, must agree to pay all costs and expenses, of every
14 kind, arising out of the removal, alteration, or interference.

15 **SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That no building or structure of any kind
16 (including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of
17 the street closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by
18 the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council
19 or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been removed and
20 relaid in accordance with the specifications and under the direction of the Director of Public
21 Works of Baltimore City.

22 **SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That after the closing under this Ordinance, all
23 subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City
24 Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon
25 notice to do so from the Director of Public Works.

26 **SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That at all times after the closing under this
27 Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized
28 representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and
29 appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining,
30 repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from
31 or pay compensation to the owner of the property.

32 **SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it
33 is enacted.
