Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilwoman Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and City representatives. She read the bill into the record.
- 2. Agency representatives testified on behalf of their respective agencies.
- 3. Councilman Dorsey discussed the value of certain parcels and parking to the City, especially for economic and community development initiatives. He would like the areas around the harbor and nearby to be accessible and an asset for all City residents and not to be reserved for specific groups at a very minimal cost. Certain groups should not benefit from an exclusive right of parking under the residential parking permits program. The policy should be reviewed. Everyone should have equal access to the parking. He does not support parking on City streets.
- 4. Liam Davis explained how the residential parking permit process works and how interested groups and parties come together to negotiate an amenable policy. He also discussed the more recent outdoor dining policy and process and how it has a similar impact on communities.
- 5. Maggie Masters testified in support of the bill on behalf of Councilmember Cohen. She indicated that the community also discussed creating certain rideshare spots.
- 6. The committee discussed Baltimore's Residential Permit Parking Program.
- 7. The committee voted to recommend the bill favorably.
- 8. The hearing was adjourned.
