12	SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
13	City Charter is proposed to be amended to read as follows:

16	§ 3. Fiscal year; Budget schedule.
17	(a) Fiscal year.
18	The fiscal, budget, and accounting year of the City shall begin on the first day of July and
19	end on the thirtieth day of June in every year unless otherwise provided by law.

3 4	NO LATER THAN FEBRUARY 15 OF EACH CALENDAR YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE SHALL PRESENT TO THE CITY COUNCIL AT A PUBLIC HEARING:
5 6 7	(I) PRELIMINARY REVENUE ESTIMATES FOR THE UPCOMING FISCAL YEAR FROM ALL EXISTING SOURCES OF REVENUE OTHER THAN THE FULL RATE OF PROPERTY TAX, INCLUDING:
8 9	(A) AMOUNTS BELIEVED TO BE COLLECTIBLE FROM TAXES FOR PRIOR YEARS; AND

25 26 27 28	NO LATER THAN APRIL 15 OF EACH CALENDAR YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE SHALL PROVIDE FINAL REVENUE ESTIMATES AND IDENTIFY AND PROVIDE AN EXPLANATION OF CHANGES FROM THE PRELIMINARY CERTIFICATION REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, IF ANY.

1	(C) [(b)] Notice and hearing.
2	At least thirty days prior to the adoption by the Board of Estimates of a proposed
3	Ordinance of Estimates the Board shall make public the Director of Finance's
4	recommended operating budget, the Planning Commission's recommended capital budget
5	and long-range capital improvement program, and the reports of the Director of Finance
6	and Planning Commission on these documents.
7	Thereafter, the Board shall hold public hearings at which members of the City Council,
8	heads of municipal agencies, and citizens shall have the opportunity to appear before the
9	Board to speak for or against the inclusion of any appropriation in the proposed
10	Ordinance of Estimates.
11	(D) [(c)] Submission to Council.
12	The Board of Estimates shall submit to the City Council the proposed Ordinance of
13	Estimates for the next fiscal year at least forty-five days before the beginning of that fiscal
14	year.
15	(E) [(d)] Adoption by Council.
16	The City Council shall have at least forty days after receipt of the Board's proposed
17	Ordinance of Estimates to enact an Ordinance of Estimates. The City Council shall adopt
18	an Ordinance of Estimates at least five days prior to the beginning of the fiscal year to
19	which it is applicable if the Board of Estimates submits its proposed Ordinance of
20	Estimates within the period prescribed by Section [3(c)] 3(D).
21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment to the City
22	Charter be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City, for adoption or rejection,
23	in accordance with Article XI-A, § 5 of the Maryland Constitution, in the form specified by the
24	City Solicitor.
