15 16	(1) INCLUDE A SUMMARY OF ALL CLOSINGS AND PUBLIC-ACCESS RESTRICTIONS THAT OCCURRED DURING THE PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR; AND

18	(I) THE NUMBER OF HOURS OF EACH CLOSING OR RESTRICTION;			
19 20	(II) WHETHER THE CLOSING OR RESTRICTION WAS PURSUANT TO A PERMIT AND, IF SO, THE TYPE OF PERMIT; AND			
21 22	(III) WHETHER THE CLOSING OR RESTRICTION WAS NECESSITATED BY AN EMERGENCY AND, IF SO, THE NATURE OF THAT EMERGENCY.			
23 24 25	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.			
26 27	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
