11 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the

- 14 Article 5. Finance, Property, and Procurement
- 15 Subtitle 28. Minority and Women's Business Enterprises

16 § 28-6. Automatic termination.

- 17 This subtitle automatically expires on June 30, [2012] 2013, unless the City Council, after
- 18 causing an appropriate study to be undertaken, conducting public hearings, and hearing
- 19 testimonial evidence, finds that the purposes identified in this subtitle have not yet been
- 20 achieved, in which case this subtitle may be extended for 5 more years.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
10 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
11 Ordinance.

12 **SECTION 3.** AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day 13 after the date it is enacted.
