24	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
25	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

5 6	"Multiple-family dwelling" has the meaning stated in § 202.2 of the Property Maintenance Code of Baltimore City.

8	(A) "REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION" DEFINED.
9 10	In this section, "reasonable accommodation" means affirmative steps that do not impose an undue financial hardship or a substantial burden.
11	(B) Prohibited conduct.
12 13 14	No bylaw, rule, of regulation governing a multiple-family dwelling, nor any action or inaction of the governing body or management of a multiple-family dwelling, may:
15 16 17	(1) impair any rights guaranteed by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution or by Articles 36 and 40 of the Maryland Declaration of Rights; or
18 19	(2) PROHIBIT OR DENY ANY REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION FOR RELIGIOUS PRACTICES, INCLUDING (BY WAY OF ILLUSTRATION AND NOT BY WAY OF LIMITATION):
20 21	(i) THE ATTACHMENT OF A RELIGIOUSLY MANDATED OBJECT TO THE FRONT-DOOR AREA OF A DWELLING UNIT; OR
22 23	(II) IN HIGH RISES, THE ADJUSTMENT OF ELEVATORS TO ALLOW FOR AUTOMATIC- STOPPING OPERATIONS.
24 25 26	(1) UNREASONABLY IMPAIR ANY RIGHTS GUARANTEED BY THE FREE-EXERCISE CLAUSE OF THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION OR BY ARTICLE 36 OF THE MARYLAND DECLARATION OF RIGHTS; OR
27	(2) PROHIBIT OR DENY ANY REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION FOR RELIGIOUS PRACTICES.
28	§ 5-24. [§ 5-21.] Penalties.
29	(a) In general.
30 31 32	Any person who violates a provision of this subtitle or of a rule, regulation, or order adopted or issued under this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to THE FOLLOWING PENALTIES:

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1 2	(1) for a violation of § 5-22 {"Constitutional rights"} of this subtitle, a fine of not more than \$1,000 for each offense; and
3	(2) FOR ANY OTHER VIOLATION, a fine of not more than \$500 for each offense.
4	(b) Each day a separate offense.
5	Each day that a violation continues is a separate offense.
6 7 8	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
