29 30 31	(2) Funds encumbered for contracts, projects, or other actual commitments and funds dedicated by any act of Congress, [or] by ANY State OR CITY law, or by the terms of any private grant to some specific purpose shall be carried over to the next fiscal year.
32 33	(3) All appropriations not so carried over shall lapse at the end of the fiscal year from which made, except that any balance remaining in the fund of the water or sanitary

2	shall remain to the credit of that utility and an estimate of [such a] THAT balance shall
3	be included in that utility's budget for the next year as an estimated receipt.

5	Charter be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City, for adoption or
6	rejection, in accordance with Article XI-A, § 5 of the Maryland Constitution, in the form
7	specified by the City Solicitor.
