Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilman Conway, primary sponsor of the Resolution gave opening remarks. Some comments, remarks etc. were:
 - Our goal is to continue the hard work of saving lives!
 - o He explained why the hearing is being held, background
 - O We want to know what it will take for the City to come into compliance, and
 - o this Resolution is part of two (2) bills, the other bill, 25-0014 Emergency Medical Services Administration of Buprenorphine; a hearing will be held on October 29th.
- 2. Chairwoman Porter went over the agency reports with the agency representatives. The representative from the Mayor's Office explained what House Bill 1099 does and what the City intends to implement to follow the law.
 - O He talked about which organizations and/or city buildings that must comply and/or does not have to follow the law
 - o He stated, "Every city building does not have to comply!
 - o That all city pools, fire departments and police officers are equipped with Naloxone!
 - o And that the Mayor will work to make sure the law is followed and implemented!
- 3. Councilman Conway gave some remarks about what he would like to see occur, such as:
 - o Signage needed
 - O Concern: Storage of Naloxone (will need some back up)
 - o Implemented:
 - Training
 - Prioritization, and leadership
 - Requested by Councilman Conway: Please submit a list of all city buildings that already have Naloxone (Narcan) in the building(s).
- 4. Committee/council members asked questions, stated concerns, and made comments. Some highlighted topics of discussion, comments and/concerns were:
 - o Questions:
 - How many city buildings do we have?
 - How many are compliant with State law (Bill 1099) requiring Naloxone to be colocated with automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in all public buildings, including city-owned facilities?
 - Timeline:
 - O What is the timeline for the rollout per State Law? Per Mayor's representative, will research and provide a follow-up!
 - o Which buildings will be included vs which will not be included? And how do you determine this?
 - What is needed to ensure city buildings are compliant?
 - Are there any aspects of Senate Bill 1099 that present challenges for compliance?
- 5. Councilman Conway gave closing remarks, "He thanked the Mayor for setting up training for employees and encourages employees to take the training. We must be thoughtful about the rollout! This could be an important step to saving lives and hopes to revisit this subject in the future!"
