A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 **Animal Control and Protection – Reconstitution**

3 FOR the purpose of reconstituting the laws governing animals and their control and protection;
4 prohibiting certain conduct; requiring licenses or permits for certain animals; providing for
5 the licensing and regulation of certain animal facilities; prohibiting the keeping of certain
6 animals; establishing standards for the general care and control of animals; establishing
7 standards for the protection of animals from cruelty, abuse, and other inappropriate conduct;
8 providing for the treatment of animals at large, dangerous animals, and vicious dogs;
9 providing for the administration of complaints; providing for the appointment of animal
10 control officers and for the enforcement of these laws by police officers, animal control
11 officers, humane officers, and other authorized persons; abolishing the Vicious Dog Hearing
12 Board and substituting for it a new Animal Hearing Board with broadened jurisdiction;
13 authorizing the adoption of rules and regulations to supplement the law; defining certain
14 terms; changing the name of the Bureau of Animal Control to Office of Animal Control;
15 imposing certain civil and criminal penalties; conforming certain related provisions; and
16 generally relating to the control and protection of animals.

27 **TITLE 10. ANIMAL CONTROL AND PROTECTION**

28 **SUBTITLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS**

29 *PART I. DEFINITIONS; PURPOSE*

30 **§ 10-101. DEFINITIONS.**

31 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

32 IN THIS TITLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED:

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1 (B) *ALTER*.

2 “ALTER” MEANS TO SURGICALLY OR CHEMICALLY RENDER AN ANIMAL INCAPABLE OF
3 REPRODUCING.

4 (C) *ANIMAL*.

5 “ANIMAL” MEANS ANY LIVING CREATURE OTHER THAN A HUMAN BEING.

6
7 (D) *ANIMAL AT LARGE*.

8 “ANIMAL AT LARGE” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 10-504 OF THIS TITLE.

9 (E) *ANIMAL CLINIC*.

10 “ANIMAL CLINIC” MEANS ANY FACILITY THAT IS REGULARLY USED BY A VETERINARIAN
11 FOR THE IMMUNIZATION, DIAGNOSIS, OR TREATMENT OF OR SURGERY ON ANIMALS.

12 (F) *ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER*.

13 “ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 10-110 {“ANIMAL
14 ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS”} OF THIS TITLE.

15 (G) *ANIMAL FANCIER*.

16 “ANIMAL FANCIER” MEANS A PERSON WHO OWNS OR KEEPS, WITHIN OR ADJOINING A
17 PRIVATE RESIDENCE, 2 OR MORE ANIMALS FOR THE NON-COMMERCIAL PURPOSES OF:

18 (1) BREEDING;

19 (2) HUNTING;

20 (3) TRACKING;

21 (4) EXHIBITION IN SHOWS; OR

22 (5) EXHIBITION IN FIELD OR OBEDIENCE TRIALS.

23 (H) *ANIMAL SHELTER*.

24 “ANIMAL SHELTER” MEANS ANY FACILITY THAT IS OWNED OR OPERATED BY OR UNDER
25 CONTRACT WITH THE CITY OR A HUMANE SOCIETY FOR THE CARE OR DETENTION OF
26 ANIMALS UNDER AUTHORITY OF STATE OR CITY LAW.

27 (I) *ANIMAL SHOW*.

28 “ANIMAL SHOW” MEANS ANY COMMERCIAL CIRCUS, VARIETY SHOW, SPECTACLE, DISPLAY,
29 ACT, OR EVENT IN WHICH ANIMALS PERFORM.

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1 (J) *BOARD.*

2 “BOARD” MEANS THE ANIMAL HEARING BOARD IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

3 (K) *CAT.*

4 (1) *IN GENERAL.*

5 “CAT” MEANS ANY DOMESTICATED FELINE.

6 (2) *EXCLUSIONS.*

7 “CAT” DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY:

8 (I) WILD OR EXOTIC FELINE; OR

9 (II) EXCEPT AS SPECIFICALLY STATED, FERAL CAT.

10 (L) *COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENT.*

11 (1) *IN GENERAL.*

12 “COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENT” MEANS, EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF
13 THIS SUBSECTION, ANY PERSON ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF SELLING,
14 TRANSFERRING, OR CONVEYING ANIMALS OR PROVIDING ANIMAL SERVICES.

15 (2) *INCLUSIONS.*

16 “COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS” INCLUDES ANY:

17 (I) ANIMAL AUCTION;

18 (II) ANIMAL SHOW;

19 (III) COMMERCIAL KENNEL;

20 (IV) COMMERCIAL PET DISTRIBUTION OR OTHER FACILITY WHERE ANIMALS ARE
21 HELD FOR SALE AT WHOLESALE OR FOR DISTRIBUTION TO OTHER COMMERCIAL
22 ESTABLISHMENTS OR TO ZOOLOGICAL PARKS, AVIARIES, OR AQUARIUMS;

23 (V) GROOMING ESTABLISHMENT OR SIMILAR FACILITY WHERE ANIMALS ARE
24 CLEANED, BATHED, CLIPPED, PLUCKED, OR OTHERWISE GROOMED FOR A FEE;

25 (VI) STABLE OR OTHER FACILITY FOR HORSES;

26 (VII) PET SHOP;

27 (VIII) PETTING ZOO OR OTHER COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENT, ACTIVITY, OR
28 FACILITY THAT PERMITS PERSONS TO COME INTO PHYSICAL CONTACT WITH
29 ANIMALS MAINTAINED BY THE ESTABLISHMENT, ACTIVITY, OR FACILITY; OR

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1 (IX) ZOOLOGICAL PARK.

2 (3) *EXCLUSIONS.*

3 “COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS” DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY:

4 (I) ANIMAL CLINIC, UNLESS IT ENGAGES IN THE BOARDING OF HEALTHY ANIMALS
5 NOT CURRENTLY BEING TREATED BY THE CLINIC;

6 (II) ANIMAL SHELTER; OR

7 (III) ANIMAL FANCIER.

8 (M) *COMMERCIAL KENNEL.*

9 (1) *IN GENERAL.*

10 “COMMERCIAL KENNEL” MEANS, EXCEPT AS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
11 SUBSECTION, ANY FACILITY:

12 (I) FOR THE COMMERCIAL BREEDING OF DOGS OR CATS; OR

13 (II) WHERE DOGS OR CATS ARE BOARDED, GROOMED, SOLD, BOUGHT, OR TRAINED
14 FOR A FEE.

15 (2) *EXCLUSIONS.*

16 “COMMERCIAL KENNEL” DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY:

17 (I) ANIMAL CLINIC, UNLESS IT ENGAGES IN THE BOARDING OF HEALTHY ANIMALS
18 NOT CURRENTLY BEING TREATED BY THE CLINIC;

19 (II) ANIMAL SHELTER; OR

20 (III) ANIMAL FANCIER.

21 (N) *CUSTODIAN.*

22 “CUSTODIAN” MEANS A PERSON:

23 (1) WHO TEMPORARILY OR PERMANENTLY PROVIDES FOOD, SHELTER, AND CARE FOR
24 AN ANIMAL IN THE ABSENCE OF THE OWNER; OR

25 (2) WHO EXERCISES CONTROL OVER THE PARTICULAR ANIMAL ON A REGULAR BASIS.

26 (O) *DANGEROUS ANIMAL.*

27 “DANGEROUS ANIMAL” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 10-702 OF THIS TITLE.

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1 (P) *DOG*.

2 “DOG” MEANS ANY MEMBER OF THE DOMESTICATED CANINE SPECIES.

3 (Q) *DOMESTICATED ANIMAL*.

4 “DOMESTICATED ANIMAL” MEANS ANY ANIMAL OF A SPECIES THAT:

5 (1) HAS BEEN BRED AND RAISED AND IS ACCUSTOMED TO LIVE IN OR ABOUT THE
6 HABITATION OF HUMANS; AND

7 (2) IS DEPENDENT ON HUMANS FOR FOOD OR SHELTER.

8 (R) *EXOTIC ANIMAL*.

9 (1) *IN GENERAL*.

10 “EXOTIC ANIMAL” MEANS:

11 (i) ANY WILD ANIMAL OF A SPECIES THAT IS NOT INDIGENOUS TO THE STATE OF
12 MARYLAND; AND

13 (ii) ANY OTHER ANIMAL THAT THE COMMISSIONER SPECIFIES BY RULE OR
14 REGULATION.

15 (2) *INCLUSIONS*.

16 “EXOTIC ANIMAL” INCLUDES ANY HYBRID ANIMAL THAT IS PART EXOTIC ANIMAL.

17 (S) *FERAL CAT*.

18 “FERAL CAT” MEANS A CAT THAT IS UNSOCIALIZED TO HUMANS AND HAS A TEMPERAMENT
19 OF EXTREME FEAR OF AND RESISTANCE TO CONTACT WITH HUMANS.

20 (T) *FERAL CAT CAREGIVER*.

21 “FERAL CAT CAREGIVER” MEANS ANY PERSON WHO, IN ACCORDANCE WITH A PROGRAM
22 APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER TO TRAP, ALTER, VACCINATE FOR RABIES, EAR TIP, AND
23 RETURN FERAL CATS:

24 (1) PROVIDES CARE, INCLUDING FOOD, SHELTER, OR MEDICAL CARE, TO THE CAT; OR

25 (2) HAS TEMPORARY CUSTODY OF THE CAT.

26 (U) *HUMANE OFFICER*.

27 “HUMANE OFFICER” MEANS AN AGENT OF A HUMANE SOCIETY WHO HAS BEEN REGISTERED
28 AND APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER TO PERFORM THE DUTIES SPECIFIED IN THIS TITLE.

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1 (v) *HUMANE SOCIETY.*

2 “HUMANE SOCIETY” MEANS AN ENTITY INCORPORATED UNDER THE LAWS OF THIS STATE
3 FOR THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS OR FOR PROMOTING THE HUMANE CARE
4 AND TREATMENT OF ANIMALS.

5 (w) *HYBRID ANIMAL.*

6 “HYBRID ANIMAL” MEANS ANY ANIMAL THAT IS A CROSS BRED BETWEEN A
7 DOMESTICATED ANIMAL, EXOTIC ANIMAL, OR WILD ANIMAL.

8 (x) *KEEP.*

9 “KEEP” MEANS FOR AN OWNER, CUSTODIAN, OR OCCUPANT OF REAL PROPERTY TO:

10 (1) FEED OR SHELTER ANY ANIMAL ON THE PREMISES OF THE OCCUPANT, CUSTODIAN,
11 OR OWNER; OR

12 (2) TO PERMIT ANOTHER TO FEED OR SHELTER ANY ANIMAL ON THE PREMISES OF THE
13 OCCUPANT, CUSTODIAN, OR OWNER.

14 (y) *OFFICE.*

15 “OFFICE” MEANS THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT’S OFFICE OF ANIMAL CONTROL OR THE
16 OFFICE’S AGENT.

17 (z) *OWNER.*

18 “OWNER” MEANS ANY PERSON WHO:

19 (1) HAS A RIGHT OF PROPERTY IN THE ANIMAL;

20 (2) IS THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF A MINOR WHO OWNS OR POSSESSES AN ANIMAL
21 (AND, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS TITLE, THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN IS
22 RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ANIMAL); OR

23 (3) IS THE INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS BEEN APPROVED FOR A LICENSE OR PERMIT OF AN
24 ANIMAL.

25 (aa) *PET.*

26 “PET” MEANS ANY ANIMAL KEPT PRIMARILY FOR PLEASURE RATHER THAN UTILITY.

27 (bb) *PET SHOP.*

28 “PET SHOP” MEANS ANY ESTABLISHMENT, WHETHER MAINTAINED SEPARATELY OR IN
29 CONNECTION WITH ANOTHER COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISE, THAT OFFERS LIVE ANIMALS FOR
30 SALE WITH THE INTENT OR EXPECTATION THAT THEY BE KEPT AS PETS.

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1 (CC) *VETERINARIAN*.

2 "VETERINARIAN" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL AUTHORIZED BY LAW TO PRACTICE VETERINARY
3 MEDICINE IN THE STATE OF MARYLAND.

4 (DD) *VICIOUS ANIMAL*.

5 "VICIOUS ANIMAL" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 10-703 OF THIS TITLE.

6 (EE) *WILD ANIMAL*.

7 "WILD ANIMAL" MEANS ANY ANIMAL THAT IS NORMALLY FOUND IN THE WILD.

8 (FF) *ZOOLOGICAL PARK*.

9 (1) *IN GENERAL*.

10 "ZOOLOGICAL PARK" MEANS A FACILITY IN WHICH MORE THAN 1 SPECIES OF ANIMAL:

11 (1) IS CONFINED WITHIN ENCLOSURES; AND

12 (2) EXHIBITED OR DISPLAYED TO THE PUBLIC FOR A FEE.

13 (2) *INCLUSIONS*.

14 "ZOOLOGICAL PARK" INCLUDES AN AQUARIUM.

15 (3) *EXCLUSIONS*.

16 "ZOOLOGICAL PARK" DOES NOT INCLUDE THE OTHER ANIMAL ESTABLISHMENTS
17 LISTED IN THE DEFINITION OF "COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENT".

18 **§ 10-102. PURPOSE OF TITLE.**

19 THE PURPOSE OF THIS TITLE IS:

20 (1) TO PROVIDE FOR THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC;

21 (2) FOR HUMANE CARE AND TREATMENT OF ANIMALS;

22 (3) FOR THE PROTECTION OF ANIMALS FROM ABUSE , CRUELTY, AND NEGLECT; AND

23 (4) FOR THE PREVENTION AND REMOVAL OF NUISANCES.

24 **§ 10-103. {RESERVED}**

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PART II. ADMINISTRATION

§ 10-104. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THE RULES AND REGULATIONS THAT THE COMMISSIONER ADOPTS UNDER § 2-106 OF THIS ARTICLE MAY INCLUDE PROVISIONS:

- (1) FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS AND LICENSES UNDER THIS TITLE;
- (2) REQUIRING THE HUMANE CARE OF ALL ANIMALS;
- (3) GOVERNING THE GENERAL CARE AND CONTROL OF ANIMALS;
- (4) GOVERNING THE OPERATION OF FACILITIES SUBJECT TO THIS TITLE;
- (5) PROVIDING FOR THE APPROVAL OF PROGRAMS TO TRAP, ALTER, VACCINATE FOR RABIES, EAR TIP, AND RETURN FERAL CATS;
- (6) TO DEFINE OR FURTHER DEFINE TERMS USED IN THIS TITLE; AND
- (7) TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE.

§ 10-105. MAYOR’S ANTI-ANIMAL ABUSE ADVISORY COMMISSION.

THE COMMISSIONER MAY REQUEST THE MAYOR’S ANTI-ANIMAL ABUSE ADVISORY COMMISSION, ESTABLISHED UNDER CITY CODE ARTICLE 1, SUBTITLE 55, TO RESEARCH BEST PRACTICES AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COMMISSIONER ABOUT THE REGULATION AND TREATMENT OF ANIMALS.

§ 10-106. FEES.

(A) *IN GENERAL.*

WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES, THE COMMISSIONER MAY SET FEES AND CHARGES FOR:

- (1) THE ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL OF ALL LICENSES AND PERMITS ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE;
- (2) THE REMOVAL OR DISPOSAL OF DEAD ANIMALS BY THE CITY FOR ANY ANIMAL CLINIC, HUMANE SOCIETY, VETERINARY OFFICE, OR OTHER INSTITUTION OR AGENCY OR PERSON; AND
- (3) ANY OF THE OTHER SERVICES PROVIDED UNDER THIS TITLE.

(B) *RETENTION OF FUNDS.*

WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES AND THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE, THE COMMISSIONER MAY RETAIN A PERCENTAGE OF ALL THE FUNDS COLLECTED FOR THE CITY

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1 UNDER THIS TITLE (E.G., FEES AND CHARGES) IN ORDER FOR THE OFFICE TO FUND ITS
2 ANIMAL CONTROL AND PROTECTION PROGRAMS IN BALTIMORE CITY.

3 **§ 10-107. CONTRACTING WITH OTHERS FOR SERVICES.**

4 WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSIONER AND THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES, THE
5 DEPARTMENT MAY ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH OTHERS TO PROVIDE SERVICES UNDER THIS
6 TITLE, EXCEPT FOR NON-DELEGABLE GOVERNMENT FUNCTIONS.

7 **§ 10-108. INSPECTIONS, INVESTIGATION OF COMPLAINTS, AND IMPOUNDMENT.**

8 (A) *INSPECTIONS.*

9 (1) IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-107 {"RIGHT OF ENTRY"} OF THIS ARTICLE AND § 104.6
10 {"RIGHT OF ENTRY"} OF THE BUILDING CODE, THE COMMISSIONER MAY INSPECT ALL
11 ANIMALS AND ALL PREMISES WHERE ANIMALS ARE KEPT.

12 (2) THE RIGHT TO MAKE THESE INSPECTIONS IS A CONDITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF ANY
13 LICENSE OR PERMIT ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE.

14 (B) *INVESTIGATION OF COMPLAINTS.*

15 THE COMMISSIONER MUST MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO INVESTIGATE ALL COMPLAINTS
16 SUBMITTED UNDER PART III OF THIS SUBTITLE.

17 (C) *IMPOUNDMENT.*

18 THE COMMISSIONER MAY IMPOUND ANIMALS AS REQUIRED OR AUTHORIZED BY THIS
19 TITLE.

20 **§ 10-109. OFFICE OF ANIMAL CONTROL.**

21 (A) *OFFICE ESTABLISHED.*

22 THERE IS AN OFFICE OF ANIMAL CONTROL IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

23 (B) *DIRECTOR.*

24 THE HEAD OF THE OFFICE IS THE DIRECTOR OF ANIMAL CONTROL, WHO IS APPOINTED BY
25 THE COMMISSIONER FROM A LIST CERTIFIED BY THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

26 (C) *STAFF.*

27 THE COMMISSIONER MAY APPOINT THE STAFF OF THE OFFICE AS PROVIDED IN TITLE 2 OF
28 THIS ARTICLE.

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1 **§ 10-110. ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.**

2 (A) *“ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER” DEFINED.*

3 IN THIS SECTION, “ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER” MEANS ANY PERSON:

- 4 (1) DESIGNATED BY THE COMMISSIONER AS AN ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER; AND
- 5 (2) APPOINTED BY THE POLICE COMMISSIONER UNDER CITY CODE ARTICLE 19, § 71-1
- 6 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ENFORCING THE ANIMAL CONTROL AND PROTECTION LAWS,
- 7 RULES, AND REGULATIONS OF THIS CITY AND STATE.

8 (B) *GENERAL DUTIES.*

9 ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ARE AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED TO:

- 10 (1) ENFORCE THIS TITLE BY IMPOUNDING ANIMALS FOUND AT LARGE, ANIMALS
- 11 INJURED, ILL, OR NEGLECTED, OR FOUND TO BE DISEASED;
- 12 (2) ENFORCE THE LICENSE, PERMIT, AND INOCULATION REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE;
- 13 (3) ENFORCE THE CRUELTY AND NEGLECT PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE BY REMOVING
- 14 AND IMPOUNDING MISTREATED ANIMALS;
- 15 (4) ADMINISTER EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE TO INJURED ANIMALS THAT COME INTO THE
- 16 CUSTODY OF THE CITY, WITHOUT NEED TO OBTAIN THE CONSENT OF THE OWNERS
- 17 OR CUSTODIANS OF THE ANIMALS;
- 18 (5) CONDUCT INSPECTIONS OF ANIMAL FACILITIES AND PRIVATE RESIDENCES, AS
- 19 DIRECTED BY THE COMMISSIONER;
- 20 (6) ISSUE CITATIONS TO PERSONS WHO ARE IN VIOLATION OF THIS TITLE; AND
- 21 (7) ENFORCE ANY REQUIREMENTS OF THE ANIMAL CONTROL AND PROTECTION LAWS,
- 22 RULES, AND REGULATIONS OF THIS CITY AND STATE.

23 (C) *ORDERS TO OWNERS, CUSTODIANS.*

24 AN ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER MAY DIRECT AN OWNER OR CUSTODIAN TO:

- 25 (1) PROVIDE VETERINARY EXAMINATION AND TREATMENT OF AN ANIMAL;

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1 (2) FOR OWNERS 65 YEARS OLD OR OLDER, THE ANNUAL FEE FOR EACH LICENSE CLASS IS
2 50% OF THE ANNUAL FEE OTHERWISE SET FOR THAT CLASS.

3 **§ 10-203. APPLICATIONS.**

4 THE APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE MUST:

5 (1) BE IN THE FORM THAT THE COMMISSIONER REQUIRES;

6 (2) BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE REQUIRED FEE; AND

7 (3) CONTAIN:

8 (I) THE NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE OWNER;

9 (II) A DESCRIPTION OF THE DOG OR CAT;

2 (1) ANY VETERINARIAN WHO ADMINISTERS A RABIES VACCINATION TO AN ANIMAL
3 MUST COMPLETE A VACCINATION CERTIFICATE AND GIVE A COPY OF THE
4 CERTIFICATE TO THE ANIMAL'S OWNER OR CUSTODIAN.

5 (2) IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT THE COMMISSIONER
6 REQUIRES, THE CERTIFICATE MUST STATE:

7 (I) THE DATE THE VACCINATION WAS ADMINISTERED; AND

8 (II) THE VACCINATION'S EXPIRATION DATE.

9 (E) *COMMISSIONER MAY OPERATE ANTI-RABIES CLINICS.*

10 THE COMMISSIONER MAY OPERATE RABIES VACCINATION CLINICS AND CHARGE
11 REASONABLE FEES TO DEFRAY THE COST OF THE SERVICES PROVIDED.

12 (F) *OTHER ANIMAL RABIES VACCINATIONS.*

13 THE COMMISSIONER MAY, BY RULE OR REGULATION, REQUIRES RABIES
14 VACCINATIONS FOR OTHER ANIMALS.

15 (G) *OWNER TO PROVIDE COPY OF RABIES VACCINATION CERTIFICATE TO CUSTODIAN.*

16 WHENEVER THE OWNER OF AN ANIMAL PLACES IT IN THE CARE OR CUSTODY OF
17 ANOTHER PERSON, THE OWNER MUST PROVIDE THAT CUSTODIAN WITH A COPY OF
18 THE ANIMAL'S RABIES VACCINATION CERTIFICATE.

19 **§ 10-302. RABIES – POSSIBLE EXPOSURE.**

20 (A) *REQUIRED REPORTING.*

21 IN ADDITION TO COMPLYING WITH STATE HEALTH-GENERAL ARTICLE, § 18-316, A
22 PERSON MUST IMMEDIATELY, BY TELEPHONE OR IN PERSON, REPORT TO THE
23 COMMISSIONER AND THE BALTIMORE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT WHENEVER
24 THAT PERSON HAS KNOWLEDGE OF:

25 (1) ANY ANIMAL SUSCEPTIBLE TO RABIES THAT:

26 (I) HAS BITTEN OR SCRATCHED AND BROKEN THE SKIN OF ANY HUMAN
27 BEING; OR

28 (II) OTHERWISE HAS EXPOSED ANY HUMAN BEING TO A POSSIBLE RABIES
29 INFECTION;

30 (2) ANY ANIMAL THAT HAS BEEN BITTEN BY ANOTHER ANIMAL SUSPECTED OF
31 HAVING RABIES; OR

32 (3) ANY OTHER ANIMAL THAT IS SUSPECTED OF HAVING RABIES.

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1 (B) *ISOLATION AND EXAMINATION.*

2 IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF STATE HEALTH-GENERAL ARTICLE,
3 § 18-316, THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO A QUARANTINED ANIMAL:

4 (1) THE ANIMAL MUST BE ISOLATED IN THE MANNER AND FOR THE PERIOD
5 THAT THE COMMISSIONER DIRECTS; AND

6 (2) AT ANY TIME DURING THE ISOLATION, THE COMMISSIONER OR THE OWNER
7 OR CUSTODIAN OF THE ANIMAL MAY DIRECT THAT THE ANIMAL BE
8 HUMANELY KILLED FOR THE PURPOSE OF RABIES TESTING.

9 (C) *EXPENSES.*

10 (1) THE ISOLATION AND EXAMINATION OF AN ANIMAL UNDER THIS SECTION IS AT
11 THE EXPENSE OF THE ANIMAL'S OWNER OR CUSTODIAN.

12 (2) WHEN THE ANIMAL IS IMPOUNDED, THE ANIMAL'S OWNER OR CUSTODIAN
13 MUST PAY TO THE OFFICE AN INITIAL DEPOSIT, AS SET UNDER § 10-106 OF THIS
14 TITLE, TOWARD EXPENSES RELATED TO ISOLATION AND EXAMINATION.

15 (D) *RELEASE OF ANIMAL.*

16 AN ANIMAL ISOLATED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY BE RELEASED ONLY:

17 (1) WITH THE CONSENT OF THE COMMISSIONER; AND

18 (2) ON PAYMENT OF:

19 (I) THE FEE SET FOR EACH DAY OR PART OF A DAY THAT THE ANIMAL
20 WAS HELD; AND

21 (II) ALL COSTS INCURRED DURING THE ISOLATION.

22 **§ 10-303. HUMANE CARE REQUIRED.**

23 EVERY OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF AN ANIMAL MUST PROVIDE THE ANIMAL WITH
24 HUMANE CARE AND TREATMENT, WHICH INCLUDES PROVIDING ALL OF THE
25 FOLLOWING:

26 (1) SUFFICIENT AND WHOLESOME FOOD AND WATER, WHICH MEANS:

27 (I) AT LEAST ONCE A DAY, THE ANIMAL MUST BE FED FOOD OF A
28 SUFFICIENT QUANTITY AND WITH ADEQUATE NUTRITIVE VALUE, IN
29 CLEAN AND SANITARY RECEPTACLES; AND

30 (II) THE ANIMAL MUST HAVE CLEAN AND DRINKABLE WATER AVAILABLE AT
31 ALL TIMES;

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1 (2) PROPER SHELTER AND PROTECTION FROM THE WEATHER, WHICH MEANS:

2 (I) THE ANIMAL MUST BE KEPT REASONABLY FREE OF URINE, FECAL
3 MATTER, AND ANY OTHER TRASH OR HAZARDOUS MATERIAL;

4 (II) THE ANIMAL MUST HAVE REASONABLE PROTECTION TO MINIMIZE HEAT
5 EXPOSURE; AND

6 (III) THE ANIMAL MUST HAVE ACCESS TO A STRUCTURALLY SOUND SHELTER
7 IN GOOD REPAIR THAT PROVIDES SUITABLE PROTECTION FROM THE
8 ELEMENTS;

9 (3) VETERINARY CARE WHEN NEEDED TO PREVENT SUFFERING OR TO MAINTAIN
10 THE ANIMAL'S HEALTH; AND

11 (4) SUFFICIENT EXERCISE SPACE, WHICH MEANS:

12 (I) THE ANIMAL MUST HAVE PROPER SPACE TO BE ABLE TO STAND TO ITS
13 FULL HEIGHT, STRETCH OUT, TURN AROUND, LIE DOWN, AND MAKE
14 NORMAL POSTURAL ADJUSTMENTS COMFORTABLY;

15 (II) THE ANIMAL MUST BE ALLOWED TO EXERCISE AND HAVE FREEDOM OF
16 MOVEMENT AS NECESSARY TO REDUCE AND MAINTAIN GOOD PHYSICAL
17 CONDITION; AND

18 (III) MORE SPECIFICALLY FOR DOGS, CATS, AND FERAL CATS:

19 A A DOG, CAT, OR FERAL CAT MAY ONLY BE CONFINED TO A CAGE
20 FOR TEMPORARY CONFINEMENT; AND

21 B. IF A DOG IS CAGED, IT MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE CAGE AND
22 EXERCISED AT LEAST:

23 1. TWICE DAILY FOR AT LEAST HALF AN HOUR EACH TIME;

25 2. ONCE A DAY FOR A MINIMUM OF 2 HOURS.

27 **§ 10-307. RESTRAINTS REQUIRED.**

28 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

29 ALL ANIMALS MUST BE RESTRAINED:

30 (1) AS REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION; AND

31 (2) IN THE CASE OF A DANGEROUS ANIMAL, AS REQUIRED BY § 10-702
32 {"DANGEROUS ANIMALS"} OF THIS TITLE.

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1 (B) *ANIMALS GENERALLY.*

2 (1) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
3 SUBSECTION, ALL ANIMALS MUST BE KEPT:

4 (I) CONFINED IN A BUILDING OR SECURE ENCLOSURE;

5 (II) SECURED BY A LEASH OR OTHERWISE; OR

6 (III) RESTRAINED ACCORDING TO RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY
7 THE COMMISSIONER.

8 (2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY WHILE THE ANIMAL IS:

9 (1) PARTICIPATING IN AN OFF-LEASH ACTIVITY APPROVED BY THE
10 COMMISSIONER; OR

11 (2) IS IN AN AREA AND DURING THE HOURS APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF
12 RECREATION AND PARKS FOR OFF-LEASH RECREATION.

13 (C) *FEMALE ANIMALS IN HEAT.*

14 EVERY FEMALE ANIMAL IN HEAT MUST BE CONFINED IN A BUILDING OR SECURE
15 ENCLOSURE SO THAT IT CANNOT COME INTO CONTACT WITH A MALE ANIMAL,
16 EXCEPT IF THE OWNER HAS AN ANIMAL FANCIER PERMIT.

17 **§ 10-308. TRANSPORTING ANIMALS.**

18 (A) *CONFINEMENT IN VEHICLE.*

19 NO PERSON MAY PLACE, CONFINED, OR ALLOW AN ANIMAL TO BE PLACED OR
20 CONFINED INSIDE A VEHICLE UNDER CONDITIONS OR FOR A PERIOD OF TIME THAT
21 ENDANGER THE HEALTH OR WELL-BEING OF THE ANIMAL DUE TO TEMPERATURE,
22 LACK OF FOOD OR DRINK, OR OTHER CONDITIONS THAT MIGHT REASONABLY BE
23 EXPECTED TO CAUSE DEATH, DISABILITY, OR SUFFERING.

24 (B) *UNENCLOSED AREA OF VEHICLE.*

25 NO PERSON MAY ALLOW AN ANIMAL TO RIDE IN THE UNENCLOSED AREA OF A
26 VEHICLE UNLESS THE ANIMAL IS CONFINED BY A SECURE TETHER OR A SECURELY
27 AFFIXED AND VENTILATED CRATE.

28 **§ 10-309. DISPOSITION OF DEAD ANIMALS.**

29 (A) *PROHIBITED DISPOSITION.*

30 THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF A DEAD ANIMAL MAY NOT:

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1 (1) DEPOSIT THE ANIMAL OR LEAVE IT EXPOSED ON ANY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE
2 PROPERTY; OR

3 (2) PLACE IT IN A STORM DRAIN OR WATERSHED AREA.

4 (B) *REQUIRED DISPOSITION.*

5 (1) DEAD ANIMALS MUST BE PROMPTLY DISPOSED OF BY CREMATION, BURIAL, OR
6 OTHER SANITARY MEANS.

7 (2) ON REQUEST, THE OFFICE MAY PICK UP DEAD DOMESTICATED ANIMALS FOR
8 DISPOSAL, SUBJECT TO A FEE FOR THE DISPOSAL AS SET UNDER § 10-105 OF
9 THIS TITLE.

10 §§ 10-310 TO 10-312. *{RESERVED}*

11 § 10-313. ANIMAL WASTE.

12 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

13 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE OWNER OR
14 CUSTODIAN OF AN ANIMAL MUST:

15 (1) HAVE IN HIS OR HER POSSESSION A MEANS FOR THE REMOVAL AND
16 SANITARY DISPOSAL OF THE ANIMAL'S FECES; AND

17 (2) IMMEDIATELY REMOVE ALL FECES LEFT BY THE ANIMAL:

18 (I) ON THAT PERSON'S OR ANY OTHER PERSON'S PRIVATE PROPERTY;
19 OR

20 (II) ON ANY PUBLIC PROPERTY, INCLUDING ANY STREET, SIDEWALK,
21 FOOT PATH, MEDIAN, GUTTER, ALLEY, PARK, OR RECREATION AREA.

22 (B) *DEPOSIT IN STORM DRAIN, ETC., PROHIBITED.*

23 THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF AN ANIMAL MAY NOT DISPOSE OF THE ANIMAL'S
24 FECES BY PLACING THEM IN A STORM DRAIN OR WATERSHED AREA.

25 (C) *EXCEPTIONS.*

26 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

27 (1) AN ANIMAL OWNED BY AND WHILE WORKING FOR A LAW ENFORCEMENT OR
28 OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY; OR

29 (2) AN ANIMAL PROFESSIONALLY TRAINED TO AID THE VISUALLY, HEARING, OR
30 MOBILITY DISABLED, WHILE ACTUALLY BEING USED FOR THAT PURPOSE.

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§ 10-314. INJURY BY VEHICLE.

IF A MOTOR VEHICLE HITS OR IS HIT BY AN ANIMAL, THE DRIVER OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE MUST IMMEDIATELY:

(1) STOP THE VEHICLE; AND

(2) IF THE ANIMAL IS INJURED OR KILLED, REPORT THE ACCIDENT TO:

(I) THE BALTIMORE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT; AND

(II) THE ANIMAL'S OWNER OR CUSTODIAN, IF THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN CAN BE DETERMINED AND LOCATED.

SUBTITLE 4. ANIMAL PROTECTION

§ 10-401. SCOPE OF SUBTITLE.

THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO:

(1) CUSTOMARY AND NORMAL VETERINARY AND AGRICULTURAL HUSBANDRY PRACTICES, INCLUDING DEHORNING, CASTRATION, TAIL DOCKING, AND LIMIT FEEDING;

(2) A LABORATORY WHERE SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH IS CARRIED OUT UNDER REGULATION OF A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY;

(3) AN ACTIVITY THAT MAY CAUSE UNAVOIDABLE PHYSICAL PAIN TO AN ANIMAL, INCLUDING FOOD PROCESSING, PEST ELIMINATION, ANIMAL TRAINING, AND HUNTING, IF THE PERSON PERFORMING THE ACTIVITY USES THE MOST HUMANE METHOD REASONABLY AVAILABLE; OR

(4) NORMAL HUMAN ACTIVITIES IN WHICH THE INFLICTION OF PAIN TO AN ANIMAL IS PURELY INCIDENTAL AND UNAVOIDABLE.

§ 10-402. NEGLIGENCE OF ANIMAL.

NO PERSON MAY NEGLECT TO PROVIDE HUMANE CARE AND TREATMENT, AS DESCRIBED IN § 10-303 {"HUMANE CARE REQUIRED"} OF THIS TITLE, FOR ANY ANIMAL THAT THE PERSON OWNS, KEEPS, RESTRAINS, OR CONFINES, WHETHER AS A PET OR FOR ANY OTHER PURPOSE.

§ 10-403. ABANDONMENT OF ANIMAL.

(A) "ABANDON" DEFINED.

IN THIS SECTION, "ABANDON" MEANS TO DESERT, FORSAKE, OR ABSOLUTELY GIVE UP AN ANIMAL WITHOUT HAVING SECURED ANOTHER OWNER OR CUSTODIAN FOR THE ANIMAL'S CARE.

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1 (B) *ABANDONMENT PROHIBITED.*

2 NO PERSON MAY ABANDON ANY ANIMAL THAT THE PERSON OWNS, KEEPS,
3 RESTRAINS, OR CONFINES, WHETHER AS A PET OR FOR ANY OTHER PURPOSE.

4 (C) *IMPOUNDED ANIMALS NOT RECLAIMED.*

5 IF AN ANIMAL HAS BEEN IMPOUNDED AND IS NOT RECLAIMED BY ITS OWNER OR
6 CUSTODIAN AFTER HAVING BEEN IMPOUNDED FOR 72 HOURS, THE ANIMAL IS
7 CONSIDERED TO BE ABANDONED AND BECOMES THE PROPERTY OF THE CITY.

8 (D) *EXCEPTION – TRANSFER TO OFFICE OR SHELTER.*

9 IF A PERSON RELEASES AND TRANSFERS OWNERSHIP OF AN ANIMAL TO THE OFFICE
10 OR TO AN ANIMAL SHELTER, THAT IS NOT AN ABANDONMENT.

11 (E) *EXCEPTION – RELEASE BY FERAL CAT CAREGIVER.*

12 IF A FERAL CAT CAREGIVER RELEASES A FERAL CAT IN ACCORDANCE WITH AN
13 APPROVED PROGRAM TO TRAP, ALTER, VACCINATE, EAR TIP, AND RETURN FERAL
14 CATS, THE FERAL CAT IS NOT CONSIDERED ABANDONED.

15 **§ 10-404. CRUELTY TO OR ABUSE OF ANIMALS.**

16 NO PERSON MAY ACT CRUELLY TO OR ABUSE ANIMALS, WHICH INCLUDES THE
17 FOLLOWING ACTIONS:

- 18 (1) TEASING, TORTURING, TORMENTING, BEATING, KILLING, DELIBERATELY
19 INCITING, INTENTIONALLY INJURING, MUTILATING, INTENTIONALLY HITTING
20 WITH A VEHICLE, OVERDRIVING, OVERLOADING, OR OTHERWISE ABUSING AN
21 ANIMAL;
- 22 (2) SUBJECTING AN ANIMAL TO CONDITIONS DETRIMENTAL TO ITS HEALTH AND
23 GENERAL WELFARE;
- 24 (3) ADMINISTERING POISON TO AN ANIMAL OR KNOWINGLY PLACING OR LEAVING
25 ANY POISONOUS OR OTHER HARMFUL SUBSTANCE WITH THE INTENT TO INJURE
26 OR KILL ANY ANIMAL OTHER THAN VERMIN;
- 27 (4) INFLECTING UNNECESSARY SUFFERING OR PAIN ON AN ANIMAL OR CAUSING
28 UNNECESSARY INJURY, SUFFERING, OF DEATH OF AN ANIMAL UNDER THE
29 INDIVIDUAL’S CHARGE OR CUSTODY;
- 30 (5) LEAVING ANY DOMESTIC ANIMAL UNATTENDED IN A PARKED, STANDING, OR
31 STOPPED VEHICLE IN A MANNER THAT ENDANGERS THE HEALTH, SAFETY, OR
32 WELFARE OF THE ANIMAL;
- 33 (6) CONFINING, TETHERING, OR ALLOWING AN ANIMAL TO REMAIN IN OUTSIDE
34 AREAS DURING PERIOD OF EXTREME WEATHER WITHOUT ACCESS TO PROPER
35 SHELTER;

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1 (7) HOARDING, ACCUMULATING, OR MAINTAINING A NUMBER OF ANIMALS IN A
2 SINGLE LOCATION, IF THE NUMBER OF ANIMALS OVERWHELMS A PERSON'S
3 ABILITY TO PROVIDE NUTRITION, SANITATION, AND VETERINARY CARE OR THE
4 PERSON FAILS TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE DETERIORATING HEALTH OF THE ANIMAL
5 OR CONDITION OF THE DWELLING OR FACILITY; OR

6 (8) CAUSING, ARRANGING, PERMITTING, OR AUTHORIZING ANY OF THE ACTIONS
7 LISTED IN THIS SECTION .

8 **§ 10-405. ANIMAL FIGHTS.**

9 (A) *"ANIMAL FIGHT" DEFINED.*

10 IN THIS SECTION, "ANIMAL FIGHT" MEANS ANY DOGFIGHT, COCKFIGHT, BULLFIGHT,
11 OR OTHER COMBAT BETWEEN ANIMALS OR BETWEEN ANIMALS AND HUMANS.

12 (B) *PROHIBITED CONDUCT.*

13 NO PERSON MAY:

14 (1) CONDUCT, CAUSE, ATTEND, OR PARTICIPATE IN ANY ANIMAL FIGHT;

15 (2) PERMIT ANY ANIMAL THAT THE PERSON OWNS OR KEEPS TO PARTICIPATE IN
16 AN ANIMAL FIGHT;

17 (3) PREPARE ANY ANIMAL FOR AN ANIMAL FIGHT;

18 (4) WAGER ON ANY ANIMAL FIGHT; OR

19 (5) BREED ANIMALS TO USE THEM FOR FIGHTING OR TO SELL THEM FOR THE
20 PURPOSE OF FIGHTING.

21 **§ 10-406. ANIMAL SHOWS.**

22 (A) *CERTAIN DEVICES PROHIBITED.*

23 NO ANIMAL SHOW MAY BE CONDUCTED OR HELD IF ANY ANIMAL IS INDUCED OR
24 ENCOURAGED TO PERFORM THROUGH THE USE OF ANY CHEMICAL, MECHANICAL,
25 ELECTRICAL, OR MANUAL DEVICE THAT IS LIKELY TO CAUSE PHYSICAL INJURY,
26 PAIN, OR SUFFERING.

27 (B) *PROPER EQUIPMENT REQUIRED.*

28 ALL EQUIPMENT USED ON OR BY A PERFORMING ANIMAL MUST FIT PROPERLY AND
29 BE IN GOOD WORKING CONDITION.

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1 **§ 10-407. EXPOSURE TO POISONS.**

2 NO PERSON MAY USE OR EXPOSE AN ANIMAL TO ANY PESTICIDE OR POISON, WHETHER
3 MIXED WITH FOOD OR NOT, WITHOUT TAKING ALL NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS TO
4 PROTECT NON-TARGET ANIMALS FROM EXPOSURE TO THE PESTICIDE OR POISON.

5 **§ 10-408. CONFINEMENT IN CAGE.**

6 NO PERSON MAY CONFINES ANY ANIMAL IN A CAGE THAT CONSISTS ENTIRELY OF SOLID
7 WALLS.

8 **§ 10-409. PROHIBITED TETHERING OF DOGS.**

9 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

10 NO PERSON MAY TETHER A DOG UNDER UNSAFE CONDITIONS, INCLUDING HARSH
11 OR EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS, THAT ENDANGER ITS HEALTH, SAFETY, OR
12 WELFARE.

13 (B) *SPECIFIC PROHIBITIONS.*

14 NO PERSON MAY TETHER A DOG:

15 (1) BY ANY MEANS OTHER THAN A FITTED COLLAR OR HARNESS;

16 (2) WITH A CHOKE COLLAR, TRAINING COLLAR, COLLAR WITH METAL SPIKES,
17 OR CHAIN; OR

18 (3) WITH A TETHER THAT:

19 (I) DOES NOT HAVE SWIVELS AT BOTH ENDS TO PREVENT KINKING AND
20 KNOTTING;

21 (II) WEIGHS MORE THAN 1/8 OF THE DOG'S BODY WEIGHT;

22 (III) IS NOT PROPERLY POSITIONED TO PREVENT THE TETHER FROM
23 BECOMING ENTANGLED IN OR AROUND OBJECTS;

24 (IV) UNREASONABLY LIMITS A DOG'S MOVEMENT;

25 (V) RESTRICTS THE DOG'S ACCESS TO SUITABLE AND SUFFICIENT FOOD,
26 CLEAN WATER, AND APPROPRIATE SHELTER;

27 (VI) IS NOT PROPERLY POSITIONED TO PREVENT THE DOG FROM

4 **§ 10-410. ANIMALS AS PRIZES OR INDUCEMENTS.**

5 NO PERSON MAY GIVE AWAY OR OFFER TO GIVE AWAY ANY LIVE ANIMAL:

- 6 (1) AS A PRIZE FOR OR AS AN INDUCEMENT TO ENTER ANY CONTEST, GAME, OR
- 7 OTHER COMPETITION;
- 8 (2) AS AN INDUCEMENT TO ENTER A PLACE OF AMUSEMENT; OR
- 9 (3) AS AN INCENTIVE TO ENTER INTO ANY BUSINESS AGREEMENT.

10 **§ 10-411. MOLESTING BIRDS.**

11 NO PERSON MAY:

- 12 (1) KILL, INJURE, MOLEST, OR ATTEMPT TO KILL, INJURE, OR MOLEST, IN ANY WAY,
- 13 ANY BIRD ON ANY OF THE STREETS, PUBLIC SQUARES, OR PARKS IN THE CITY;
- 14 OR
- 15 (2) DESTROY, REMOVE, OR ATTEMPT TO DESTROY OR REMOVE, ANY BOX PLACED
- 16 IN ANY TREE OR OTHER SUITABLE PLACE IN THE CITY FOR THE USE OF THESE
- 17 BIRDS.

18 **SUBTITLE 5. PUBLIC NUISANCE ANIMALS**

19 **§ 10-501. DEFINITIONS.**

20 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

21 IN THIS SUBTITLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

22 (B) *PUBLIC NUISANCE ANIMAL.*

23 “PUBLIC NUISANCE ANIMAL” MEANS AN ANIMAL THAT:

- 24 (1) IS FOUND AT LARGE;
- 25 (2) DAMAGES THE PROPERTY OF ANYONE OTHER THAN ITS OWNER OR
- 26 CUSTODIAN;
- 27 (3) DEFECATES ON PUBLIC PROPERTY;
- 28 (4) URINATES OR DEFECATES ON PRIVATE PROPERTY;
- 29 (5) MOLESTS OR INTIMIDATES PEDESTRIANS OR PASSERSBY;

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- 1 (6) CHASES VEHICLES;
- 2 (7) EXCESSIVELY MAKES DISTURBING NOISES (INCLUDING CONTINUED OR
- 3 REPEATED HOWLING, BARKING, WHINING, OR OTHER UTTERANCES) THAT
- 4 CAUSE UNREASONABLE ANNOYANCE, DISTURBANCE, OR DISCOMFORT TO
- 5 NEIGHBORS OR OTHERS IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THE PREMISES WHERE THE
- 6 ANIMAL IS KEPT;
- 7 (8) FOULS THE AIR BY ODOR SO AS TO CAUSE UNREASONABLE ANNOYANCE OR
- 8 DISCOMFORT TO NEIGHBORS OR OTHERS IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THE
- 9 PREMISES WHERE THE ANIMAL IS KEPT;
- 10 (9) CAUSES UNSANITARY CONDITIONS IN ENCLOSURES OR SURROUNDINGS
- 11 WHERE THE ANIMAL IS KEPT;
- 12 (10) BY VIRTUE OF THE NUMBER OR TYPES OF ANIMALS MAINTAINED, IS
- 13 OFFENSIVE OR DANGEROUS TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE;
- 14 (11) ATTACKS OTHER ANIMALS; OR
- 15 (12) HAS BEEN FOUND BY THE COMMISSIONER TO BE A PUBLIC NUISANCE
- 16 ANIMAL BY VIRTUE OF BEING OFFENSIVE OR A DANGER TO THE PUBLIC
- 17 HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE.

18 (C) *PUBLIC NUISANCE CONDITION.*

19 (1) *IN GENERAL.*

20 “PUBLIC NUISANCE CONDITION” MEANS:

21 (I) AN UNSANITARY, DANGEROUS, OR OFFENSIVE CONDITION CAUSED BY:

22 A. THE SIZE, NUMBER, OR TYPES OF ANIMALS MAINTAINED OR

23 KEPT;

24 B. THE INADEQUACY OF THE FACILITIES; OR

25 C. THE MANNER OR METHOD OF HOLDING, CONFINING,

26 RESTRAINING, BOARDING, OR TRAINING ANIMALS; OR

27 (II) ANY OTHER CONDITION THAT THE COMMISSIONER DEEMS TO BE A

28 PUBLIC NUISANCE CONDITION.

29 (2) *INCLUSIONS.*

30 “PUBLIC NUISANCE CONDITION” INCLUDES ANY PREMISES IN WHICH:

31 (I) AN ANIMAL IS MAINTAINED OR KEPT UNDER A CONDITION THAT

32 CONSTITUTES NEGLIGENCE OF OR CRUELTY TO THE ANIMAL; OR

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1 (II) THE ANIMAL IS IN AN UNSANITARY CONDITION.

2 **§ 10-502. OWNER OR CUSTODIAN TO EXERCISE CARE AND CONTROL.**

3 EVERY OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF AN ANIMAL MUST EXERCISE PROPER CARE AND
4 CONTROL TO PREVENT THE ANIMAL FROM BECOMING A PUBLIC NUISANCE ANIMAL.

5 **§ 10-503. NUISANCES PROHIBITED.**

6 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

7 NO PERSON MAY KEEP OR MAINTAIN ANY ANIMAL IN THE CITY IN A MANNER THAT:

8 (1) CAUSES OR PERMITS IT TO BE A PUBLIC NUISANCE ANIMAL; OR

9 (2) CAUSES OR PERMITS THE ANIMAL TO CAUSE A PUBLIC NUISANCE
10 CONDITION.

11 (B) *DISTURBING HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE.*

12 NO PERSON MAY KEEP OR MAINTAIN ANY ANIMAL IN THE CITY IN A MANNER THAT
13 DISTURBS THE HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE OF ANY PERSON.

14 **§ 10-504. ANIMALS AT LARGE.**

15 (A) *“ANIMAL AT LARGE” DEFINED.*

16 “ANIMAL AT LARGE” MEANS ANY ANIMAL THAT IS:

17 (1) OFF THE PREMISES OF ITS OWNER OR CUSTODIAN; AND

18 (2) NOT UNDER RESTRAINT IN THE MANNER REQUIRED BY § 10- 307
19 {RESTRAINTS REQUIRED”} OF THIS TITLE.

20 (B) *PROHIBITED CONDUCT.*

21 NO OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF AN ANIMAL MAY ALLOW IT TO BE AN ANIMAL AT
22 LARGE.

23 (C) *RESTRAINTS AND CONTROL.*

24 WHEN AN ANIMAL IS OFF THE PREMISES OF THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN, THE
25 ANIMAL MUST BE:

26 (1) RESTRAINED AS REQUIRED BY § 10-307 {“RESTRAINTS REQUIRED”}; AND

27 (2) UNDER THE CONTROL OF A PERSON WHO IS CAPABLE OF CONTROLLING AND
28 PHYSICALLY RESTRAINING THE ANIMAL.

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1 (D) *OFF-LEASH RECREATION.*

2 AN ANIMAL THAT IS PARTICIPATING IN AN OFF-LEASH ACTIVITY APPROVED BY THE
3 COMMISSIONER OR IS IN AN AREA AND DURING THE HOURS APPROVED BY THE
4 DIRECTOR OF RECREATION AND PARKS FOR OFF-LEASH RECREATION IS NOT AT
5 LARGE UNLESS THE ANIMAL LEAVES THE ACTIVITY OR AREA OR REMAINS BEYOND
6 THE APPROVED HOURS.

7 **SUBTITLE 6. WILD ANIMALS, ETC.; PROHIBITED ANIMALS**

8 **§ 10-601. WILD, EXOTIC, AND HYBRID ANIMALS.**

9 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

10 EXCEPT AS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, NO PERSON MAY KEEP
11 OR ALLOW TO BE KEPT ON THAT PERSON'S PREMISES ANY WILD, EXOTIC, OR
12 HYBRID ANIMAL WITHOUT A PERMIT FROM THE COMMISSIONER TO DO SO.

13 (B) *RULES AND REGULATIONS.*

14 BY RULE OR REGULATION, THE COMMISSIONER MAY SET:

- 15 (1) QUALIFICATIONS FOR OBTAINING A PERMIT;
- 16 (2) CONDITIONS FOR KEEPING THE ANIMAL;
- 17 (3) THE TERM OF THE PERMIT;
- 18 (4) GROUNDS FOR DENYING, AMENDING, SUSPENDING, REVOKING, OR REFUSING
19 TO RENEW THE PERMIT; AND
- 20 (5) OTHER LIMITATIONS THE COMMISSIONER FINDS NECESSARY OR
21 APPROPRIATE.

22 (C) *EXCEPTIONS.*

23 THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

- 24 (1) AN ANIMAL SHOW OR ZOOLOGICAL PARK LICENSED UNDER THIS TITLE AND
25 REGULATED BY A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY; OR
- 26 (2) A LABORATORY WHERE SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH IS CARRIED OUT UNDER
27 REGULATION OF A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY.

28 **§ 10-602. IMPORTATION OF WILD RABBITS AND HARES.**

29 (A) *"WILD RABBIT OR HARE" DEFINED.*

30 IN THIS SECTION, "WILD RABBIT OR HARE" MEANS ANY RABBIT OR HARE THAT HAS
31 NOT BEEN BRED AND SUPERVISED IN A PROPERLY MAINTAINED RABBITRY.

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1 (B) *PROHIBITED CONDUCT.*

2 EXCEPT AS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, NO PERSON MAY:

3 (1) BRING OR IMPORT INTO THE CITY, FOR SALE, ANY WILD RABBIT OR HARE,
4 DEAD OR ALIVE; OR

5 (2) SELL OR OFFER FOR SALE IN THE CITY ANY IMPORTED WILD RABBIT OR
6 HARE, DEAD OR ALIVE.

7 (C) *EXCEPTIONS.*

8 THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE IMPORTATION OF WILD RABBITS OR HARES
9 BY THE FOLLOWING, IF DONE IN CONFORMITY WITH THE REGULATIONS OF THE
10 COMMISSIONER:

11 (1) AN ANIMAL SHOW OR ZOOLOGICAL PARK LICENSED UNDER THIS TITLE AND
12 REGULATED BY A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY; OR

13 (2) A LABORATORY WHERE SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH IS CARRIED OUT UNDER
14 REGULATION OF A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY.

15 **§ 10-603. OTHER PROHIBITED ANIMALS.**

16 (A) *COMMISSIONER MAY PROHIBIT.*

17 BY RULE OR REGULATION, THE COMMISSIONER MAY PROHIBIT OTHER ANIMALS
18 FROM BEING KEPT IN THE CITY AS NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE TO PROTECT THE
19 HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC.

20 (B) *KEEPING PROHIBITED.*

21 EXCEPT AS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, NO PERSON MAY KEEP
22 OR ALLOW TO BE KEPT ON THAT PERSON'S PREMISES ANY ANIMAL THAT THE
23 COMMISSIONER PROHIBITS UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

24 (C) *EXCEPTIONS.*

25 THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

26 (1) AN ANIMAL SHOW OR ZOOLOGICAL PARK LICENSED UNDER THIS TITLE AND
27 REGULATED BY A STATE OF MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY; OR

28 (2) A LABORATORY WHERE SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH IS CARRIED OUT UNDER
29 REGULATION OF A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY.

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1 **SUBTITLE 7. ATTACK DOGS; DANGEROUS AND VICIOUS ANIMALS.**

2 **§ 10-701. ATTACK DOGS.**

3 (A) *ATTACK DOG DEFINED.*

4 IN THIS SECTION, “ATTACK DOG” MEANS A DOG THAT IS TRAINED TO ATTACK ON
5 COMMAND.

6 (B) *KEEPING OR TRAINING PROHIBITED.*

7 EXCEPT AS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, NO PERSON MAY KEEP
8 OR TRAIN ANY ATTACK DOG IN THE CITY.

9 (C) *EXCEPTION.*

10 THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A DOG OWNED BY AND WORKING FOR LAW
11 ENFORCEMENT OR OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY.

12 **§ 10-702. DANGEROUS ANIMALS.**

13 (A) *“DANGEROUS ANIMAL” DEFINED.*

14 “DANGEROUS ANIMAL” MEANS ANY ANIMAL THAT:

15 (1) HAS BITTEN OR ATTACKED A HUMAN BEING OR ANOTHER ANIMAL WITHOUT
16 PROVOCATION;

17 (2) EXHIBITS AGGRESSIVE OR DANGEROUS BEHAVIOR AND IS NOT ADEQUATELY
18 CONFINED OR RESTRAINED;

19 (3) IS KNOWN OR SUSPECTED TO BE AN ANIMAL EXPOSED TO RABIES AND IS
20 NOT ADEQUATELY CONFINED OR RESTRAINED; OR

21 (4) REQUIRES CONFINEMENT OR RESTRAINTS TO PROTECT THE HEALTH,
22 SAFETY, OR WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC.

23 (B) *HEARING.*

24 THE ANIMAL HEARING BOARD MUST DETERMINE IF AN ANIMAL IS A DANGEROUS
25 ANIMAL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE HEARING PROCEDURES OF SUBTITLE 10 OF THIS
26 TITLE.

27 (C) *RESTRAINTS REQUIRED.*

28 EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE ORDERED BY THE ANIMAL HEARING BOARD, EVERY
29 DANGEROUS ANIMAL MUST BE:

30 (1) MAINTAINED IN A BUILDING OR SECURE ENCLOSURE ON THE PREMISES OF
31 ITS OWNER OR CUSTODIAN; AND

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1 (2) WHENEVER OUTSIDE OF THE BUILDING OR ENCLOSURE:

2 (I) SECURELY CAGED;

3 (II) SECURELY MUZZLED AND LEASHED; OR

4 (III) RESTRAINED BY ANY OTHER APPROPRIATE METHOD REQUIRED BY
5 THE BOARD.

6 (D) *OTHER REQUIREMENTS.*

7 AN OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF AN ANIMAL FOUND TO BE A DANGEROUS ANIMAL
8 MUST:

9 (1) HAVE THE ANIMAL MICROCHIPPED AND ALTERED AT THE OWNER'S OR
10 CUSTODIAN'S EXPENSE;

11 (2) DISPLAY A "DANGEROUS ANIMAL" SIGN, VISIBLE TO THE PUBLIC, ON THE
12 PROPERTY WHERE THE ANIMAL IS KEPT;

13 (3) IF THE ANIMAL IS KEPT OUTSIDE OF THE DWELLING, INSTALL A PERIMETER
14 FENCE ON THE PROPERTY OR A PORTION OF THE PROPERTY;

15 (4) NOTIFY THE OFFICE IF THE ANIMAL IS LOOSE, HAS BITTEN ANOTHER
16 DOMESTICATED ANIMAL OR HUMAN BEING, OR HAS VIOLATED ANY OTHER
17 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE;

18 (5) NOTIFY THE OFFICE IF THE ANIMAL HAS DIED OR IS BEING RELOCATED TO
19 ANOTHER JURISDICTION; AND

20 (6) BEFORE TRANSFERRING OWNERSHIP OR CUSTODY OF THE DANGEROUS
21 ANIMAL TO ANOTHER:

22 (I) NOTIFY THE OFFICE IN WRITING OF THE NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE
23 NEW OWNER OR CUSTODIAN; AND

24 (II) NOTIFY THE NEW OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF THE ANIMAL'S
25 DANGEROUS BEHAVIOR.

26 (E) *ANIMALS DETERMINED DANGEROUS BY ANOTHER JURISDICTION.*

27 (1) ANIMALS DETERMINED DANGEROUS BY ANOTHER JURISDICTION ARE
28 AUTOMATICALLY CONSIDERED DANGEROUS IN THE CITY.

29 (2) THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN MUST IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE OFFICE IF ANY
30 ANIMAL DETERMINED DANGEROUS IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION IS TRANSPORTED
31 INTO THE CITY.

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1 (3) IF ANOTHER JURISDICTION DEFINES “DANGEROUS ANIMAL” DIFFERENTLY THAT
2 AS DEFINED IN THIS SECTION OR MAKES A DETERMINATION USING A TERM
3 OTHER THAN “DANGEROUS”, THE ANIMAL HEARING BOARD MUST DETERMINE
4 IF THE CRITERIA USED IN THE OTHER JURISDICTION IS APPROPRIATE FOR THE
5 ANIMAL TO BE CONSIDERED DANGEROUS IN THE CITY.

6 (F) *EXCEPTIONS.*

7 THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

- 8 (1) AN ANIMAL SHOW OR ZOOLOGICAL PARK LICENSED UNDER THIS TITLE AND
9 REGULATED BY A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY; OR
- 10 (2) A LABORATORY WHERE SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH IS CARRIED OUT UNDER
11 REGULATION OF A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY.

12 **§ 10-703. VICIOUS ANIMALS – DEFINITION.**

13 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

14 IN THIS SUBTITLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

15 (B) *VICIOUS ANIMAL.*

16 (1) *IN GENERAL.*

17 “VICIOUS ANIMAL” MEANS ANY ANIMAL THAT:

- 18 (I) HAS SEVERELY BITTEN OR ATTACKED A HUMAN BEING OR ANOTHER
19 ANIMAL; OR
- 20 (II) HAS BEEN PREVIOUSLY DEEMED DANGEROUS, AND SUBSEQUENTLY
21 BITTEN OR ATTACKED A HUMAN BEING OR OTHER ANIMAL SO THAT THE
22 ANIMAL SHOULD BE IMMEDIATELY KILLED TO PROTECT THE HEALTH,
23 SAFETY, OR WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC.

24 (2) *EXCLUSIONS – INSTIGATION BY OTHER.*

25 “VICIOUS ANIMAL” DOES NOT INCLUDE AN ANIMAL THAT HAS BITTEN OR
26 ATTACKED IF THE INJURY, DAMAGE, WAS SUSTAINED BY ONE WHO:

- 27 (I) AT THE TIME WAS COMMITTING A WILLFUL TRESPASS OR OTHER TORT
28 ON THE PREMISES OCCUPIED BY THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF THE
29 ANIMAL;
- 30 (II) WAS TORMENTING, ABUSING, OR ASSAULTING THE ANIMAL;
- 31 (III) IN THE PAST HAS BEEN OBSERVED OR REPORTED TO HAVE TORMENTED,
32 ABUSED, OR ASSAULTED THE ANIMAL; OR

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1 (IV) WAS COMMITTING OR ATTEMPTING TO COMMIT A CRIME.

2 (3) *EXCLUSIONS – PROTECTING SELF OR OTHERS OR IN PAIN.*

3 “VICIOUS ANIMAL” DOES NOT INCLUDE AN ANIMAL THAT HAS BITTEN OR
4 ATTACKED IF THE ANIMAL WAS:

5 (I) PROTECTING OR DEFENDING ITSELF, ITS YOUNG, OR ANOTHER ANIMAL;

6 (II) RESPONDING TO PAIN OR INJURY; OR

7 (III) PROTECTING OR DEFENDING A HUMAN BEING WITHIN THE IMMEDIATE
8 VICINITY OF THE ANIMAL FROM PHYSICAL ATTACK OR ASSAULT.

9 **§ 10-704. VICIOUS ANIMALS – HEARING.**

10 THE ANIMAL HEARING BOARD MUST DETERMINE IF AN ANIMAL IS A VICIOUS ANIMAL
11 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE HEARING PROCEDURES OF SUBTITLE 10 OF THIS TITLE.

12 **§ 10-705. VICIOUS ANIMALS – AT LARGE.**

13 IF AN ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, POLICE OFFICER, OR HUMANE OFFICER FINDS AN
14 ANIMAL AT LARGE, AND IF THE ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, POLICE OFFICER, OR
15 HUMANE OFFICER REASONABLY BELIEVES THAT THE ANIMAL IS A VICIOUS ANIMAL AND
16 THAT THE ANIMAL CANNOT BE TAKEN UP OR TRANQUILIZED AND IMPOUNDED, THE
17 ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, POLICE OFFICER, OR HUMANE OFFICER MAY KILL THE
18 ANIMAL.

19 **§ 10-706. VICIOUS ANIMALS – KEEPING PROHIBITED.**

20 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

21 NO PERSON MAY KEEP IN THE CITY ANY ANIMAL THAT THE BOARD DETERMINES TO
22 BE A VICIOUS ANIMAL.

23 (B) *EXCEPTION.*

24 THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO AN ANIMAL OWNED BY AND WORKING FOR A
25 LAW ENFORCEMENT OR OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY.

26 **SUBTITLE 8. IMPOUNDMENT**

27 **§ 10-801. AUTHORITY TO IMPOUND.**

28 AN ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, POLICE OFFICER, HUMANE OFFICER, OR OTHER
29 PERSON AUTHORIZED AND CONTRACTING WITH THE CITY TO DO SO MAY IMPOUND ANY
30 ANIMAL:

31 (1) FOUND AT LARGE;

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- 1 (2) WHOSE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN DOES NOT HAVE THE REQUIRED LICENSE OR
- 2 PERMIT FOR THE ANIMAL;
- 3 (3) THAT IS FOUND WITHOUT A LICENSE TAG REQUIRED BY THIS TITLE;
- 4 (4) THAT POSES A THREAT TO PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE;
- 5 (5) REASONABLY BELIEVED TO BE A DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS ANIMAL;
- 6 (6) PLACED AT RISK BY ITS HEALTH OR ENVIRONMENT;
- 7 (7) THAT IS ABANDONED;
- 8 (8) THAT IS PROHIBITED IN THE CITY;
- 9 (9) THAT IS A PUBLIC NUISANCE ANIMAL;
- 10 (10) WHOSE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN IS IN VIOLATION OF THIS TITLE; OR
- 11 (11) WHOSE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN IS IN VIOLATION OF ANY OTHER ANIMAL

- 13 STATE.

14 **§ 10-802. RIGHT OF ENTRY AND IMPOUNDMENT.**

15 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

16 ON THE DETERMINATION THAT AN ANIMAL SHOULD BE IMPOUNDED, AN ANIMAL
17 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, POLICE OFFICER, HUMANE OFFICER, OR OTHER PERSON
18 AUTHORIZED AND CONTRACTING WITH THE CITY TO DO SO MAY ENTER ONTO
19 PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY, REMOVE THE ANIMAL, AND IMPOUND IT AT AN
20 ANIMAL SHELTER OR OTHER FACILITY APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER.

21 (B) *FACILITY TO NOTIFY OFFICE.*

22 IF AN ANIMAL IS IMPOUNDED, THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF THE FACILITY MUST
23 IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE OFFICE OF THE IMPOUNDMENT AND PROVIDE ANY
24 INFORMATION THAT THE OFFICE REASONABLY REQUIRES.

25 **§ 10-803. NOTICE.**

26 (A) *NOTICE REQUIRED.*

27 WHEN AN ANIMAL IS IMPOUNDED, THE OFFICE MUST MAKE A REASONABLE
28 ATTEMPT TO PROVIDE NOTICE OF THE IMPOUNDMENT TO THE ANIMAL'S OWNER OR
29 CUSTODIAN.

30 (B) *CONTENTS OF NOTICE.*

31 THE NOTICE MUST INCLUDE:

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- 1 (1) THE NAME, IF KNOWN, OF THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN;
- 2 (2) A DESCRIPTION OF THE ANIMAL SEIZED;
- 3 (3) THE VIOLATION OF THIS TITLE, INCLUDING A REFERENCE TO THE SPECIFIC
- 4 LEGAL AUTHORITY FOR THE IMPOUNDMENT;
- 5 (4) THE MANNER AND TIME IN WHICH THE PERSON MUST EITHER:
 - 6 (I) RECLAIM THE ANIMAL; OR
 - 7 (II) REQUEST A HEARING ON THE VIOLATION;
- 8 (5) A CONTACT PERSON AND TELEPHONE NUMBER AT THE OFFICE; AND
- 9 (6) A STATEMENT THAT IF THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN FAILS TO ACT WITHIN 72
- 10 HOURS OF THE IMPOUNDMENT, THE ANIMAL WILL BECOME THE PROPERTY
- 11 OF THE CITY.

12 (C) *UNKNOWN OWNER OR CUSTODIAN.*

13 IF THE OFFICE CANNOT ASCERTAIN THE IDENTITY AND ADDRESS OF THE OWNER OR

14 CUSTODIAN, THE ANIMAL IS CONSIDERED ABANDONED AND BECOMES PROPERTY OF

15 THE CITY AFTER 72 HOURS FROM THE IMPOUNDMENT.

16 **§ 10-804. HOLDING PERIOD; HEARING.**

17 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

18 THE IMPOUNDED ANIMAL MUST BE KEPT FOR AT LEAST 72 HOURS, UNLESS SOONER

19 RECLAIMED BY ITS OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OR OTHERWISE REQUIRED BY LAW.

20 (B) *DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS ANIMAL.*

21 IF THE OFFICE REASONABLY BELIEVES THAT THE ANIMAL IS A DANGEROUS OR

22 VICIOUS ANIMAL, THE OFFICE MUST HOLD THE ANIMAL PENDING A HEARING UNDER

23 SUBTITLE 10 OF THIS TITLE.

24 (C) *REQUEST FOR HEARING.*

25 IF THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN IS AGGRIEVED BY THE ANIMAL'S IMPOUNDMENT, HE

26 OR SHE MAY REQUEST A HEARING UNDER SUBTITLE 10 OF THIS TITLE.

27 **§ 10-805. RECLAIMING ANIMAL.**

28 (A) *RIGHT TO RECLAIM.*

29 THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN HAS THE RIGHT TO RECLAIM THE ANIMAL WITHIN 72

30 HOURS OF THE IMPOUNDMENT.

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1 (B) *REQUISITES FOR RECLAIMING.*

2 IF THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN SEEKS TO RECLAIM THE ANIMAL, THE OFFICE MAY
3 REQUIRE THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN TO:

- 4 (1) PROVIDE PROOF OF LEGAL TITLE TO OR CUSTODIANSHIP OF THE ANIMAL OR
5 PROVIDE AN AFFIDAVIT OF LEGAL TITLE OR CUSTODIANSHIP;
- 6 (2) DEMONSTRATE THAT THE ANIMAL HAS THE REQUIRED LICENSE OR PERMIT;
- 7 (3) PAY ANY FEES OR EXPENSES REQUIRED BY THE OFFICE FOR THE CARE,
8 FEEDING, HOUSING, AND VETERINARY CARE OF THE ANIMAL DURING THE
9 IMPOUNDMENT;
- 10 (4) ALLOW THE OFFICE TO MICROCHIP THE ANIMAL AT THE OWNER'S OR
11 CUSTODIAN'S EXPENSE; AND
- 12 (5) ALLOW THE OFFICE TO ALTER THE ANIMAL AT THE OWNER'S OR
13 CUSTODIAN'S EXPENSE.

14 **§ 10-806. UNCLAIMED OR SURRENDERED ANIMALS.**

15 (A) *UNCLAIMED ANIMALS.*

16 IF AN IMPOUNDED ANIMAL IS NOT RECLAIMED WITHIN 72 HOURS OF
17 IMPOUNDMENT, THE ANIMAL IS ABANDONED AND IMMEDIATELY BECOMES
18 PROPERTY OF THE CITY.

19 (B) *SURRENDERED ANIMAL.*

20 IF AN ANIMAL IS SURRENDERED TO THE OFFICE BY ITS OWNER, THE ANIMAL
21 IMMEDIATELY BECOMES PROPERTY OF THE CITY.

22 (C) *DISPOSITION.*

23 ONCE AN ANIMAL BECOMES CITY PROPERTY UNDER THIS SECTION, THE OFFICE
24 MUST:

- 25 (1) PLACE THE ANIMAL FOR ADOPTION;
- 26 (2) HUMANELY EUTHANIZE THE ANIMAL; OR
- 27 (3) TRANSFER THE ANIMAL BY ANY METHOD THAT IS ADVANTAGEOUS TO THE
28 CITY AND THE PUBLIC INTEREST AND IS NOT PROHIBITED BY LAW.

29 **§ 10-807. ALTERATION**

30 AN ANIMAL THAT BECOMES CITY PROPERTY UNDER THIS SUBTITLE MAY BE ALTERED
31 BEFORE BEING RELEASED FOR ADOPTION, RESCUE, OR OTHERWISE, UNLESS THE
32 ANIMAL WEIGHS LESS THAN 2 POUNDS.

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§ 10-808. OTHER FEES.

EVEN IF AN ANIMAL IS NOT RECLAIMED BY THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN, THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN MAY STILL BE REQUIRED TO PAY FOR FEES OR EXPENSES RELATED TO THE IMPOUNDMENT THROUGH THE DATE WHEN THE ANIMAL BECAME CITY PROPERTY.

SUBTITLE 9. HORSE RIDING AND DRIVING

PART I. DEFINITIONS; SCOPE

§ 10-901. DEFINITIONS.

(A) *IN GENERAL.*

IN THIS SUBTITLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(B) *HORSE.*

“HORSE” MEANS A HORSE, PONY, DONKEY, OR MULE THAT IS:

(1) OWNED, DRIVEN, USED, OR QUARTERED IN THE CITY, WHETHER PERMANENTLY OR TEMPORARILY; AND

(2) USED FOR:

(I) RIDING, DRIVING, OR BREEDING;

(II) SHOWING OR PERFORMING IN ANY EXHIBITION OR ANIMAL SHOW;
OR

(III) ANY WORK OR LABOR.

(C) *DRIVING.*

“DRIVING” MEANS THE PROCESS OF USING A HORSE:

(1) FOR RIDING; OR

(2) FOR PULLING A WAGON, CART, CARRIAGE, OR OTHER VEHICLE OR DEVICE.

(D) *DRIVING LICENSE.*

“DRIVING LICENSE” MEANS A LICENSE ISSUED BY THE COMMISSIONER TO USE A HORSE:

(1) FOR RIDING; OR

(2) FOR PULLING A WAGON, CART, CARRIAGE, OR OTHER VEHICLE OR DEVICE.

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1 (E) *STABLE*.

2 “STABLE” MEANS ANY PLACE WHERE HORSES ARE:

- 3 (1) BOARDED OR DISPLAYED;
- 4 (2) RENTED FOR RIDING, DRIVING, OR OTHER PURPOSES; OR
- 5 (3) BRED, BOUGHT, SOLD, TRAINED, OR TRADED.

6 (F) *STABLE OPERATOR*.

7 “STABLE OPERATOR” MEANS THE PERSON WHO OWNS OR IS IN CHARGE OF A
8 STABLE.

9 **§ 10-902. EXEMPTIONS.**

10 THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO ANY HORSE THAT IS:

- 11 (1) IN THE CUSTODY OF A ZOOLOGICAL PARK OR ITS AGENTS OR CONTRACTORS, IF
12 THE ZOOLOGICAL PARK IS LICENSED UNDER THIS TITLE AND REGULATED BY A
13 MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY;
- 14 (2) IN A LABORATORY WHERE SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH IS CARRIED OUT UNDER
15 REGULATION OF A MARYLAND OR FEDERAL AGENCY; OR
- 16 (3) REGULATED BY THE MARYLAND RACING COMMISSION.

17 **§§ 10-903 TO 10-904. {RESERVED}**

18 *PART II. DRIVING LICENSES*

19 **§ 10-905. DRIVING LICENSE REQUIRED.**

20 (A) *IN GENERAL*.

21 EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION, NO ONE MAY DRIVE A HORSE
22 UNLESS:

- 23 (1) HE OR SHE IS 18 YEARS OLD OR OLDER;
- 24 (2) HAS BEEN ISSUED A DRIVING LICENSE BY THE COMMISSIONER; AND
- 25 (3) HAS THAT DRIVING LICENSE WITH HIM OR HER WHILE DRIVING THE HORSE.

26 (B) *EXCEPTIONS*.

27 THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE RIDER OF A HORSE THAT IS BEING HELD OR
28 LED, DURING THE ENTIRE PERIOD OF RENTAL OR USE, BY A CUSTODIAN WITH A
29 VALID DRIVING LICENSE.

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1 (C) *WAIVERS.*

2 THE COMMISSIONER MAY WAIVE THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION FOR
3 INDIVIDUALS PARTICIPATING IN:

- 4 (1) ANIMAL SHOWS;
- 5 (2) ORGANIZED COMPETITIONS;
- 6 (3) SPECIAL EVENTS INVOLVING THE TRANSPORTATION OF PEOPLE IN
7 CARRIAGES OR SLEIGHS; OR
- 8 (4) SIMILAR EVENTS.

9 **§ 10-906. APPLICATIONS.**

10 THE APPLICATION FOR A DRIVING LICENSE MUST:

- 11 (1) BE IN THE FORM THAT THE COMMISSIONER REQUIRES; AND
- 12 (2) CONTAIN THE INFORMATION THAT THE COMMISSIONER CONSIDERS NECESSARY
13 TO DETERMINE WHETHER AN APPLICANT:
 - 14 (I) IS CAPABLE OF HUMANELY HANDLING A HORSE; AND
 - 15 (II) OTHERWISE QUALIFIED FOR A DRIVING LICENSE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE
16 AND THE RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER IT.

17 **§ 10-907. ISSUANCE; FORM; FEE.**

18 (A) *ISSUANCE.*

19 THE OFFICE MUST ISSUE A DRIVING LICENSE TO THE APPLICANT IF:

- 20 (1) THE APPLICANT QUALIFIES FOR THE LICENSE; AND
- 21 (2) PAYS THE REQUIRED FEE.

22 (B) *FORM.*

23 THE DRIVING LICENSE MUST CONTAIN:

- 24 (1) THE LICENSEE'S FULL LEGAL NAME, CURRENT ADDRESS, DATE OF BIRTH,
25 SEX, HEIGHT, WEIGHT, AND EYE, SKIN, AND HAIR COLORS; AND
- 26 (2) A CLEAR, FULL-FACE, HEAD-AND-SHOULDERS PHOTOGRAPH OF THE DRIVER
27 THAT:
 - 28 (i) WAS TAKEN WITHIN THE PRECEDING 12 MONTHS; AND

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1 (II) MEASURES 1¼" BY 1¼".

2 **§ 10-908. TERM.**

3 UNLESS SOONER SUSPENDED OR REVOKED, A DRIVING LICENSE EXPIRES ANNUALLY ON
4 THE ANNIVERSARY DATE OF ITS ISSUANCE.

5 **§ 10-909. DENIAL, SUSPENSION, REVOCATION, ETC.**

6 THE COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH MAY DENY, AMEND, SUSPEND, REVOKE, OR REFUSE TO
7 RENEW A DRIVING LICENSE AS PROVIDED IN SUBTITLE 2, PART III, OF THIS TITLE.

8 **§§ 10-910 TO 10-911. {RESERVED}**

9 *PART III. REQUIRED CARE*

10 **§ 10-912. EXAMINATION BY VETERINARIAN.**

11 (A) *ANNUAL EXAMINATION REQUIRED.*

12 THE CUSTODIAN OF EVERY HORSE MUST HAVE THE HORSE EXAMINED BY A
13 VETERINARIAN AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR.

14 (B) *SCOPE OF EXAMINATION.*

15 THE EXAMINATION MUST COVER:

16 (1) THE GENERAL CONDITION OF THE HORSE AND ITS TEETH, HOOFS, AND
17 SHOES; AND

18 (2) THE HORSE'S STAMINA AND PHYSICAL ABILITY TO CARRY THE LOADS AND
19 PERFORM THE WORK FOR WHICH IT IS INTENDED.

20 (C) *VETERINARIAN'S RECORD.*

21 (1) THE VETERINARIAN MUST MAKE A RECORD OF:

22 (I) ANY INJURY, DISEASE, OR DEFICIENCY DETECTED; AND

23 (II) ANY PRESCRIPTION OR RECOMMENDATION FOR CURING OR CORRECTING
24 THAT CONDITION OR FOR ANY OTHER DISPOSITION OF THE HORSE.

25 (2) THE VETERINARIAN MUST PROVIDE A COPY OF THAT RECORD TO THE HORSE'S
26 CUSTODIAN.

27 (D) *CUSTODIAN TO RETAIN RECORDS.*

28 THE CUSTODIAN MUST:

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1 (1) KEEP A COPY OF THE RECORD FOR AT LEAST 3 YEARS; AND

2 (2) MAKE IT AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION BY AN ANIMAL ENFORCEMENT
3 OFFICER, POLICE OFFICER, OR HUMANE OFFICER DURING NORMAL BUSINESS
4 HOURS.

5 **§ 10-913. GENERAL LIMITATIONS ON USE.**

6 WHENEVER A HORSE IS BEING USED FOR ANY PURPOSE ON THE STREETS OF THE CITY,
7 THE CUSTODIAN OF THE HORSE:

8 (1) MUST TREAT THE HORSE IN A HUMANE MANNER, NEVER BEAT OR PROD IT IN
9 ANY WAY THAT WILL CAUSE PAIN OR INJURY TO THE HORSE, AND NEVER
10 INTENTIONALLY, KNOWINGLY, OR OBVIOUSLY BE CRUEL TO THE HORSE;

11 (2) MAY NOT USE, WORK, DRIVE, RIDE, OR REQUIRE LABOR FROM THE HORSE FOR
12 MORE THAN 10 HOURS IN ANY 24-HOUR PERIOD, WITH ADEQUATE REST
13 PERIODS DURING THOSE 10 HOURS;

14 (3) AT REASONABLE INTERVALS, MUST PERMIT THE HORSE TO HAVE FOOD AND
15 DRINKING WATER FROM A CLEAN CONTAINER THAT IS OF SUFFICIENT SIZE AND
16 IN GOOD CONDITION;

17 (4) DURING TIMES OF COLD OR INCLEMENT WEATHER, MUST DRAPE THE BODY OF
18 THE HORSE, FROM FORELEGS TO HIND LEGS, WITH A WARM COVERING THAT IS
19 IN GOOD CONDITION;

20 (5) MUST ATTEND THE HORSE AT ALL TIMES, AS FOLLOWS:

21 (I) IF THE HORSE IS ONLY BEING USED FOR RIDING PURPOSES, IT MUST BE
22 SECURELY TIED TO AN IMMOVABLE OBJECT OR HELD, LED, OR MOUNTED
23 BY AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS PHYSICALLY ABLE TO MAINTAIN FULL
24 CONTROL OF THE HORSE; AND

25 (II) IF THE HORSE IS BEING USED FOR ANY OTHER DRIVING PURPOSE, IT
26 MUST BE WITHIN 75 FEET OF ITS CUSTODIAN AND WITHIN THE
27 CUSTODIAN'S SIGHT;

28 (6) MAY NOT OVERDRIVE OR OVERLOAD THE HORSE, AS EVIDENCED BY PHYSICAL
29 STRESS, STRAIN, OR EXHAUSTION OF THE HORSE; AND

30 (7) MUST OBEY ANY ORDER ISSUED BY THE COMMISSIONER THAT RELATES TO THE
31 CARE AND TREATMENT OF THE HORSE.

32 **§ 10-914. LIMITATIONS ON DRIVING – GENERAL.**

33 WHENEVER A HORSE IS BEING USED FOR DRIVING PURPOSES ON THE STREETS OF THE
34 CITY, THE CUSTODIAN OF THE HORSE:

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- 1 (1) MUST ASSURE THAT ANY WAGON, CART, CARRIAGE, VEHICLE, OR SIMILAR
2 DEVICE BEING USED IS IN GOOD CONDITION, THAT ITS AXLES ARE
3 WELL-GREASED, AND THAT ITS OPERATING MECHANISMS ARE IN GOOD
4 WORKING ORDER;
- 5 (2) DURING WARM WEATHER, MUST PARK THE HORSE IN THE SHADE WHEN
6 PRACTICABLE;
- 7 (3) IF THE WAGON, CART, CARRIAGE, VEHICLE, OR SIMILAR DEVICE IS EQUIPPED
8 WITH BRAKES, MUST PUT THE BRAKES INTO A LOCKED POSITION AT ALL TIMES
9 WHEN NOT MOVING; AND
- 10 (4) MAY NOT CAUSE OR PERMIT THE HORSE TO GALLOP.

11 **§ 10-915. LIMITATIONS ON DRIVING – WEATHER.**

12 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

13 NO CUSTODIAN OF A HORSE MAY PERMIT ITS USE OR WORK ON THE PUBLIC STREETS
14 WHENEVER:

- 15 (1) THE TEMPERATURE EXCEEDS 92° F. OR FALLS BELOW 20° F., AS
16 ANNOUNCED BY THE LOCAL RADIO SERVICE;
- 17 (2) AN OFFICIAL “SNOW EMERGENCY” IS IN EFFECT; OR
- 18 (3) BECAUSE OF ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS, THE COMMISSIONER OF
19 HEALTH OR SOME OTHER AUTHORIZED OFFICIAL OF THE CITY ISSUES A
20 DETERMINATION, BY RADIO OR OTHER MEANS, THAT IT WOULD BE
21 DANGEROUS OR UNSUITABLE FOR A HORSE TO BE ON THE STREETS.

22 (B) *RETURN TO STABLE.*

23 IF A HORSE IS ALREADY IN USE WHEN A CONDITION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A)
24 OF THIS SECTION BEGINS, THE CUSTODIAN MUST IMMEDIATELY RETURN THE
25 HORSE, BY THE MOST DIRECT ROUTE, TO THE STABLE FROM WHICH IT WAS
26 OBTAINED.

27 **§ 10-916. EQUIPMENT.**

28 THE CUSTODIAN OF EVERY HORSE:

- 29 (1) MUST ASSURE THAT THE SADDLE, HARNESS, SHOES, BRIDLE, AND ALL OTHER
30 EQUIPMENT REQUIRED OR IN USE:
 - 31 (I) ARE IN GOOD WORKING ORDER;
 - 32 (II) FIT PROPERLY; AND
 - 33 (III) WILL NOT CAUSE PHYSICAL PAIN OR INJURY TO THE HORSE;

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1 (2) MAY NOT USE CURB BITS, TWISTED WIRE, TWISTED WIRE SNAFFLES, SPURS,
2 BUCKING STRAPS, FLANK STRAPS, OR SIMILAR DEVICES; AND

3 (3) MUST INSPECT THE HORSE AND ALL ITS EQUIPMENT AND OTHER ATTACHMENTS:

4 (I) WHENEVER IT DEPARTS FROM THE STABLE;

5 (II) WHENEVER IT RETURNS TO THE STABLE; AND

6 (III) IF NOT BEING USED, AT LEAST ONCE DAILY.

7 **§ 10-917. QUARTERS.**

8 (A) *PROPER QUARTERS REQUIRED.*

9 (1) EVERY CUSTODIAN MUST ENSURE THAT EVERY HORSE IS QUARTERED IN A
10 LIGHTED, CLEAN, DRY, AND PROPERLY VENTILATED STABLE OR BARN AND
11 THAT ALL OTHER REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION ARE MET.

12 (2) IF THE QUARTERS FOR THE HORSE MEET THE DEFINITION OF “HORSE RIDING
13 AND RENTAL STABLES” IN STATE AGRICULTURE ARTICLE, TITLE 2, SUBTITLE 7,
14 THE CUSTODIAN AND OWNER MUST ALSO COMPLY WITH THE APPLICABLE
15 REQUIREMENTS OF THAT LAW.

16 (B) *STALLS.*

17 EVERY HORSE’S STALL MUST BE:

18 (1) LARGE ENOUGH TO PERMIT THE HORSE TO TURN AROUND EASILY;

19 (2) CLEANED DAILY; AND

20 (3) SUPPLIED WITH ADEQUATE BEDDING OF STRAW, SHAVINGS, OR OTHER
21 SUITABLE HYGIENIC MATERIAL, WHICH MUST BE CHANGED AS OFTEN AS
22 NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN A CLEAN AND DRY CONDITION.

23 (C) *BLANKETS.*

24 BLANKETS MUST BE AVAILABLE AND USED AS NECESSARY DURING COLD WINTER
25 PERIODS.

26 (D) *IDENTIFICATION.*

27 FOR EMERGENCY PURPOSES, THE EXTERIOR OF THE STABLE OR BARN ENTRANCE
28 MUST CONSPICUOUSLY DISPLAY, IN AT LEAST 2-INCH LETTERING, THE
29 CUSTODIAN’S FULL NAME, BUSINESS ADDRESS, AND BUSINESS AND HOME
30 TELEPHONE NUMBERS.

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1 **§ 10-918. SICK OR INJURED HORSES.**

2 (A) *TREATMENT REQUIRED; UNNECESSARY MOVING PROHIBITED.*

3 IF A HORSE IS SICK, DISEASED, LAME, INJURED, OR IN PAIN:

4 (1) THE CUSTODIAN OF THE HORSE MUST TAKE ACTION TO OBTAIN IMMEDIATE
5 VETERINARY TREATMENT, CARE, AND ATTENTION; AND

6 (2) THE HORSE MAY NOT BE MOVED OR DRIVEN, EXCEPT:

7 (I) TO OBTAIN REQUIRED VETERINARY TREATMENT, CARE, AND
8 ATTENTION; OR

9 (II) TO OBTAIN IMMEDIATE HUMANE KEEPING OR PASTURE.

10 (B) *USE DURING RECOVERY PERIOD.*

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§ 10-1010. HOLDING ANIMAL PENDING APPEALS.

(A) *OFFICE TO HOLD ANIMAL.*

THE OFFICE MAY CONTINUE TO HOLD AND CARE FOR AN ANIMAL IMPOUNDED UNDER THIS TITLE UNTIL ALL APPEALS ARE COMPLETED.

(B) *EXPENSES OF HOLDING ANIMAL.*

ALL COSTS FOR CARE OR OTHER EXPENSES OF THE ANIMAL INCURRED BY THE OFFICE FROM THE TIME OF THE IMPOUNDMENT TO THAT FINAL DECISION OF THE COURT ARE A PERSONAL DEBT DUE TO THE CITY OR ITS AGENT BY THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN OF THE ANIMAL.

§ 10-1011. COSTS OF CARE PENDING JUDICIAL REVIEW.

(A) *PREPAYMENT OF ESTIMATED COSTS REQUIRED.*

IF AN ANIMAL'S OWNER OR CUSTODIAN PETITIONS FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW OF THE FINAL DECISION OF THE DEPARTMENT, THE ANIMAL'S OWNER OR CUSTODIAN MUST PREPAY TO THE CITY OR ITS AGENT THE ESTIMATED COST OF CARING FOR THE ANIMAL FOR EACH 30-DAY PERIOD DURING THE REVIEW, BEGINNING ON THE DATE OF THE PETITION FOR REVIEW.

(B) *OFFICE TO ESTIMATE.*

THE OFFICE OR ITS AGENT MUST ESTIMATE THE COST, WHICH MAY INCLUDE:

- (1) FOOD, VETERINARY CARE, AND OTHER NECESSITIES THAT A RESPONSIBLE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN WOULD PROVIDE FOR THE ANIMAL; AND
- (2) OTHER COSTS, SUCH AS STAFFING AND ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES, ALLOWED BY RULE OR REGULATION OF THE COMMISSIONER.

(C) *TIME . METHOD OF PAYMENT.*

- (1) THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN MUST PREPAY THE ESTIMATED COSTS WITHIN 10 DAYS OF RECEIVING NOTICE FROM THE OFFICE OR ITS AGENT OF THE AMOUNT.
- (2) THE PREPAYMENT MUST BE MADE IN CASH OR BY BOND OR OTHER METHOD ACCEPTABLE TO THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE.

(D) *JUDICIAL REVERSAL.*

IF THE FINAL DECISION OF THE COURT OVERTURNS THE IMPOUNDMENT, THE CITY MUST REIMBURSE THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN FOR ALL PAYMENTS MADE BY THE OWNER OR CUSTODIAN FOR THE CARE OF THE ANIMAL DURING IMPOUNDMENT.

§ 10-1101. ENFORCEMENT BY CITATION.

(A) *IN GENERAL.*

IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER CIVIL OR CRIMINAL REMEDY OR ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURE, THIS TITLE MAY BE ENFORCED BY ISSUANCE OF:

(1) AN ENVIRONMENTAL CITATION UNDER CITY CODE ARTICLE 1, SUBTITLE 40 {"ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL BOARD"}; OR

(2) A CIVIL CITATION UNDER CITY CODE ARTICLE 1, SUBTITLE 41 {"CIVIL CITATIONS"}.

(B) *PROCESS NOT EXCLUSIVE.*

THE ISSUANCE OF A CITATION TO ENFORCE THIS TITLE DOES NOT PRECLUDE PURSUING ANY OTHER CIVIL OR CRIMINAL REMEDY OR ENFORCEMENT ACTION AUTHORIZED BY LAW.

§ 10-1105. CRIMINAL PENALTIES.

(A) *IN GENERAL.*

(1) ANY PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS TITLE, OR A RULE OR REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS TITLE, OR A LAWFUL DIRECTIVE OR ORDER ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND, ON CONVICTION, IS SUBJECT TO THE PENALTIES SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION.

(C) *MISREPRESENTATION: \$1,000 AND 30 DAYS.*

FOR A VIOLATION OF § 10-112 {"OBSTRUCTING, ETC., OFFICER; FALSE STATEMENTS"} OF THIS TITLE, THE PENALTY IS A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS OR BOTH FINE AND IMPRISONMENT FOR EACH OFFENSE.

(D) *ANIMAL PROTECTION: \$1,000 AND 90 DAYS.*

FOR A VIOLATION OF SUBTITLE 4 {"ANIMAL PROTECTION"} OR SUBTITLE 9 {"HORSE RIDING AND DRIVING"} OF THIS TITLE, THE PENALTY IS A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 90 DAYS OR BOTH FINE AND IMPRISONMENT FOR EACH OFFENSE.

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1 (E) *ATTACK DOGS AND VICIOUS DOGS: \$1,000 AND 6 MONTHS.*

2 FOR A VIOLATION OF § 10-701 {"ATTACK DOGS"} OR § 10-706 {"VICIOUS
3 ANIMALS – KEEPING PROHIBITED"} OF THIS TITLE, THE PENALTY IS A FINE OF NOT
4 MORE THAN \$1,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 6 MONTHS OR BOTH
5 FINE AND IMPRISONMENT FOR EACH OFFENSE.
