12	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the

18	(b) Composition.
19	(1) The Board [shall be composed of] COMPRISES:
20	(i) the Director of Finance, EX OFFICIO;
21	(ii) the Director of [Public Works] TRANSPORTATION, EX OFFICIO;
22	(iii) the Police Commissioner, EX OFFICIO;

1 2	(IV) A MEMBER OF THE CITY COUNCIL, TO BE APPOINTED BY THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT; AND

21 22	The Board is [hereby] authorized to deny, suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew any license under this subtitle if [the Board finds that]:
23 24	(1) the applicant or licensee furnished or made misleading or false statements on reports, certifications, or written documents required by this subtitle;
25 26 27	(2) DURING THE PRECEDING 3 YEARS, a court of competent jurisdiction has found an applicant for a license or a licensee guilty of criminal activity [during the preceding 3 years] directly relating to the operation of the business of towing;
28 29	(3) a court of competent jurisdiction has found a tow truck operator guilty of a criminal act THAT WAS authorized by the licensee;
30 31 32	(4) a motor vehicle has been towed by a towing service without the consent of the owner or operator of the motor vehicle, without the direction of the Police Department, or without complying with local, state, or federal law;
33 34	(5) a tow truck operator has failed to comply with any law regulating the towing of motor vehicles;
35 36	(6) the licensee has failed to make available for inspection by the Board or the Police Department the daily towing log [as] required by § 22-10(d) OF THIS SUBTITLE;

1	(7) the licensee has failed to allow the Police Department reasonable access to inspect
2	any motor vehicle listed in the licensee's records that is stored upon the storage
3	facility of the towing service; [or]
4	(8) THE BOARD HAS RECEIVED 5 OR MORE VALID INDIVIDUAL COMPLAINTS OF UNFAIR
5	OR IMPROPER BUSINESS PRACTICES AGAINST A GIVEN APPLICANT OR LICENSEE
6	within a 6-month period; or
7	(9) [(8)] the applicant or licensee has failed to comply with or has violated the
8	provisions of this subtitle, the rules or regulations adopted [pursuant to] UNDER
9	this subtitle, or any applicable federal, state, or local law or rule.
10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
11	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
12	Ordinance.
13	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day
14	after the date it is enacted.
