I support legislation to reconstitute the Baltimore City Board of Ethics, with the following requests for clarification/and or further review:

- 1. Section 3-2(a)(2) (page 4, line 3), provides the Mayor may reject a nominee of the President of the City Council or the Comptroller only for "cause." There is no definition of "cause" for this purpose. "Cause" should be defined.
- 2. Section 3-20 (b)(2) An exception to the training, is permitted for "an official, who within the 5 years preceding his or her appointment or reappointment, completed a training course provided under this section."

It is recommended that this exception be deleted. To assure that officials are aware of and remain informed of the ethics laws and in the interest of protecting the public by reinforcing high ethical standards, the training should be a requirement upon appointment or reappointment. Five years is a long period of time. Such a period between training may result in lapses in understanding of the requirements and the importance of the ethics laws.
