16	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
17	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

3	Part 2A. Firearms – Reporting Theft or Loss

5 6	In this Part 2A, "firearm" includes any pistol, revolver, rifle, shotgun, short-barreled rifle, short-barreled shotgun, or other firearm.
7	§ 59-18. Reporting required.
8 9 10	On the theft or loss in the City of a firearm, the person who owned or possessed the firearm shall report the theft or loss to the Baltimore Police Department. The report shall be made within 48 hours of discovering the theft or loss.
11	§ 59-19. Enforcement by citation.
12	(A) IN GENERAL.
13 14 15	In addition to any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement procedure, this section may be enforced by issuance of a civil citation under City Code Article 1, Subtitle 41 {"Civil Citations"}.
16	(B) PROCESS NOT EXCLUSIVE.
17 18 19	The issuance of a civil citation to enforce this section does not preclude pursuing any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement action authorized by Law.
20	§ 59-20. Criminal penalties.
21 22	Any person who violates $\S$ 59-18 of this Part 2A is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine of not more than $\$250$ for each offense.
23 24 25	<b>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
26 27	<b>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
