AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

City Streets – Naming an Unnamed Alley Jazz Alley

FOR the purpose of naming an unnamed alley, located perpendicular to and between South Carrollton Avenue and South Carlton Street and to the rear of the properties known as 1123/1125 through 1141/1143 West Baltimore Street, parallel with West Baltimore Street and Hollins Street.

Article 26 - Surveys, Streets, and Highways

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That an unnamed 10-foot alley located perpendicular to and between South Carrollton Avenue and South Carlton Street and to the rear of the properties known as 1123/1125 through 1141/1143 West Baltimore Street, being parallel with West Baltimore Street and Hollins Street, is named Jazz Alley.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.
