Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 18-0190 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would terminate the peak hour parking restrictions for several blocks on East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street. Any administrative regulation concerning general parking, stopping or one-way streets implemented by the Department of Transportation may be rescinded or modified by ordinance pursuant to Section 2-6(d) of Article 31 of the Baltimore City Code.

This bill is the required legislation to rescind these parking restrictions, which the Law Department approves for form and legal sufficiency.
