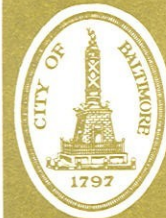

City Council Bill 09-0098R has been introduced for the purpose of expressing support of State and City capital investment in the Green House Residences at Stadium Place, Maryland's first Green House long-term care facility, a model of sustained independence and respectful care for frail, elderly adults, proposed for Stadium Place in Baltimore City and in service to the entire Region: *It's Not a Nursing Home. It's the Newest "Miracle on 33<sup>rd</sup> Street"*.

As part of its mission to the elderly, the Greater Ecumenical Development Corporation (GEDCO) is proposing to develop Green House Residences at Stadium Place located on 33<sup>rd</sup> Street in Baltimore City. This project will establish 49 residents for long-term care for the frail and elderly.

The Department of Housing has included this project its Fiscal 2010-2015 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget request. A total of \$500,000 is requested; \$250,000 in Fiscal 2010 and \$250,000 in Fiscal 2011 to support this project.

The Department of Finance has no objection to the passage of Council Bill 09-0098R.
