Dear Honorable President Cohen and Members of the City Council:

I am pleased to inform your Honorable Body that I have signed into law this day the following bills:

**25-0062 – Building Code – Single Exit from Residential Occupancy** – For the purpose of permitting certain residential buildings to have a single exit or access to a single exit, so long as certain conditions are met regarding the construction of the exit.

**25-0063 – Zoning Administrator – Transfer to Department of Planning** – For the purpose of transferring the Office of Zoning Administrator and all attendant authorities and duties from the Department of Housing and Community Development to the Department of Planning.

**25-0064 – Zoning – Bulk and Yard Requirements – Amendments** – For the purpose of amending certain bulk and yard requirements in residential zoning districts.

**25-0065 – Zoning – Eliminating Off-Street Parking Requirements** – For the purpose of repealing requirements for providing a minimum number of off-street parking spaces per use type; setting certain parking maximums; and correcting, clarifying, and conforming related provisions and tables.

**INTRODUCTION AND READ FIRST TIME**

The President laid before the City Council the following bills and Resolutions of the Mayor and City Council for first reading:

**Bill No. 25-0116** – By: Councilmember Jones

Cosponsored by: President Cohen and Councilmembers Dorsey, Conway, Middleton, Torrence, Bullock, Blanchard, Ramos, Gray, Porter, Schleifer, and Glover

An Ordinance requiring a certain type of employer to provide specified minimum compensation to a certain class of employee; defining certain terms; providing for the effective dates of this Ordinance; providing for the termination of certain provisions of this Ordinance; and generally relating to compensation for security officers.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Labor and Workforce Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0117** – By: Councilmember Porter

An Ordinance permitting, subject to certain conditions, the establishment, maintenance, and operation of the premises for live entertainment on the property known as 1421 Ridgely Street (Block 0839, Lot 004) in the C-4 Zoning District, as outlined in red on the accompanying plat; and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Land Use and Transportation Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0118** – By: Councilmember Ramos

An Ordinance approving the application of Urban Green LLC, acting as authorized agent of the owner of certain real property located at 2700-2798 Tivoly Avenue, 2701-2793 Tivoly Avenue, 2700-2770 Fenwick Avenue, 1701-1711 28th Street, 1811-1813 28th Street, 2700-2740 Hugo Avenue, and 2701-2735 Hugo Avenue, to have that property designated Planned Unit Development; and approving the Development Plan submitted by the applicant; and approving a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Land Use and Transportation Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0119** – By: The Council President (The Administration – Department of Transportation)

An Ordinance requiring a permit applicant to demonstrate that sidewalks adjoining a subject property comply with certain accessibility standards; establishing sidewalk accessibility standards; obligating a real property owner to construct, maintain, and repair accessible sidewalks; amending the minimum permitted sidewalk width in the City; establishing that a real property owner shall be responsible for inspection and repair of sidewalks and curb ramps to meet accessibility standards at or before certain trigger events; establishing a new authority under which the Director of Transportation may require repair or replacement of a sidewalk; amending fines for noncompliance; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the construction and maintenance of accessible sidewalks in the City.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Land Use and Transportation Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0120** – By: The Council President (The Administration – Department of Planning)

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary Mayoralty Capital Project Fund Capital Appropriation in the amount of \$13,650,000 to the Baltimore City Information Technology – PRJ002423 911111 127-116 (Broadband for Public Housing Sites), to provide funding for the Memorandum of Understanding between the City and the Housing Authority of Baltimore City to install broadband internet service at public housing sites; and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Budget and Appropriations Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0121** – By: The Council President (The Administration – Department of Planning)

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary Convention Center Capital Project Fund Capital Appropriation in the amount of \$200,000 to the Convention Center – PRJ002554 998001 534-001 (Convention Center Annual Contribution), to provide funding for capital improvements at the Convention Center; and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Budget and Appropriations Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0122** – By: The Council President (The Administration – Department of Planning)

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary Department of Transportation Project Fund Capital Appropriation in the amount of \$2,000,000 to the Department of Transportation – PRJ002909 (West Baltimore United), to provide funding for deconstruction and redevelopment of U.S. 40 Highway to Nowhere; and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Budget and Appropriations Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0123** – By: The Council President (The Administration – Department of Planning)

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary Department of Transportation Project Fund Capital Appropriation in the amount of \$15,500,000 to the Department of Transportation – PRJ002913 (Hanover Street Corridor and Vietnam Veterans Memorial Bridge National Environmental Protection Act Study), to advance concept planning studies for multi-modal transportation improvements to a 30% Design; and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Budget and Appropriations Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0124** – By: The Council President (The Administration – Department of Planning)

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary Department of Transportation Project Fund Capital Appropriation in the amount of \$498,000 to the Department of Transportation – PRJ003511 (Jones Falls Gateway), to design a segment of the Jones Falls Trail; and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Budget and Appropriations Committee.

**Bill No. 25-0125** – By: The Council President (The Administration – Department of Planning)

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary Department of Planning Project Fund Capital Appropriation in the amount of \$17,000,000 to the Department of Planning – PRJ003617 (Middle Branch Resiliency Initiative - MBRI), to support the South Baltimore Gateway Partnership to design and construct the Smith Cove Project (SCP); and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Budget and Appropriations Committee.

### **Recognizing November as National Family Caregivers Month**

**Recitals**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Baltimore honors and celebrates the immeasurable contributions of family caregivers, who selflessly care for aging parents, spouses, children, friends, and loved ones with disabilities, chronic illnesses, or complex medical needs.

**WHEREAS**, family caregivers are the backbone of the long-term care system, enduring emotional strain, financial hardship, and physical exhaustion while providing uncounted hours of unpaid care each year which enables their loved ones to remain in their homes and communities.

**WHEREAS**, National Family Caregivers Month is a time to recognize and uplift the strength and resilience demonstrated by caregivers, who embody the values of love, sacrifice, and service that strengthen the fabric of Baltimore's families and neighborhoods.

**WHEREAS**, it is essential that Baltimore City affirms its commitment to supporting caregivers through greater awareness, expanded access to resources, and advocacy for equitable policies that promote caregiver health, economic security, and quality of life.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Baltimore expresses profound gratitude to all caregivers and encourages public, private, nonprofit, and faith-based organizations to join in honoring these everyday heroes who give so much of themselves for others.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, that the City Council recognizes November as National Family Caregivers Month, honors City residents who provide care to their loved ones in need, and calls on City agencies, organizations, and residents to celebrate and support the family caregivers of the City.

**BILL NO. 25-0005R REPORTED FAVORABLY  
AND ADOPTED**

Councilmember Porter, for the Public Health and Environment Committee, reported Bill No. 25-0005R favorably.

**Informational Hearing – Availability of Naloxone in Public Buildings**

FOR the purpose of requiring the City Administrator, Commissioner of the Baltimore Health Department, and the Director of the Department of General Services to appear before the City Council to present an assessment of the City’s readiness to comply with the provisions of Chapter 764 of the Acts of the Maryland General Assembly of 2024, “Emergency Services – Automated External Defibrillator and Naloxone Co-Location Initiative – Requirements for Public Buildings”, by updating its health and safety protocols for all City buildings.

**Recitals**

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 764 of the Acts of the Maryland General Assembly of 2024, “Emergency Services – Automated External Defibrillator and Naloxone Co-Location Initiative – Requirements for Public Buildings”, requires local jurisdictions to require that naloxone be co-located with each automated defibrillator placed in a public building.

**WHEREAS**, to ensure Baltimore’s full compliance with Chapter 764, it is necessary to determine whether relevant City agencies, including the Baltimore City Health Department and the Department of General Services, are meeting the standards established in the Chapter.

**WHEREAS**, City agencies must ensure that the City’s public health protocols and building standards align with the requirements of Chapter 764.

**WHEREAS**, the Baltimore City Council recognizes the importance of maintaining public health and safety standards in the City’s facilities and ensuring that all appropriate measures are taken to comply with State law to improve health outcomes and safeguard City residents.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council is committed to taking any immediate action necessary to rectify any deficiencies identified by City agencies and to ensuring that all facilities and operations comply with State-mandated health and safety standards, as directed by Chapter 764.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council encourages continuing collaboration between the City Administrator, the Health Department, the Department of General Services, and any other relevant City agencies to facilitate ongoing compliance with Chapter 764.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the City Council requires the City Administrator, Commissioner of the Baltimore Health Department, and the Director of the Department of General Services to appear before the City Council to present an assessment of the City's readiness to comply with the provisions of Chapter 764 of the Acts of the Maryland General Assembly of 2024 by updating its health and safety protocols for all City buildings.

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the City Administrator, the Baltimore City Health Commissioner, the Director of the Department of General Services, the Secretary of the Maryland Department of Health, and the Mayor's Legislative Liaison to the City Council.

Favorable report adopted.

**“§ 20-9. CIVIL PENALTY.**

A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE OR OF A RULE OR REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000 FOR EACH OFFENSE.”

The roll was called on the amendment, resulting as follows:
