3	FOR the purpose of requiring a person who owns, controls, possesses, or has custody of a dirt
4	bike or an unregistered motorcycle or similar vehicle to immobilize that vehicle while in
5	Baltimore City; modifying certain restrictive provisions relating to published notice of a
6	forfeiture petition; repealing certain provisions authorizing repossession of a vehicle pending
7	a decision on forfeiture; prohibiting a secured party from selling a forfeited vehicle to the
8	owner or other person from whom it was seized; correcting, clarifying, and conforming
9 10	related language; and generally relating to dirt bikes or unregistered motorcycles or similar vehicles.

21	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
22	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

26	Part 2. Prohibited Operations

1	§ 40-6. Driving or riding; LEAVING UNIMMOBILIZED.
2	(A) Driving or riding vehicle.
3	No person may drive or ride any dirt bike or any unregistered motorcycle or similar
4	vehicle on any public or private property that is located in Baltimore City or, wherever
5	located, that is owned or regulated by the City.
6	(b) Possessing unimmobilized vehicle.
7	No person may own, control, possess, or have custody of any dirt bike or any
8	UNREGISTERED MOTORCYCLE OR SIMILAR VEHICLE IN BALTIMORE CITY UNLESS THE
9	VEHICLE IS SECURELY LOCKED OR OTHERWISE IMMOBILIZED BY A WHEEL CLAMP OR
10	OTHER OBJECT, DEVICE, METHOD, OR MECHANISM, WHETHER ATTACHED TO THE VEHICLE
11	OR NOT, THAT:
12	(1) PREVENTS THE VEHICLE FROM BEING FREELY MOVED; AND
13	(2) CANNOT BE REMOVED OR DEACTIVATED WITHOUT THE ASSISTANCE OF THE
14	VEHICLE'S OWNER.
15	Part 3. Seizure and Forfeiture
16	§ 40-14. Forfeiture petition; notice.
17	(a) Filing; copies to parties in interest.
18	If the Solicitor determines that the vehicle should be forfeited, the Solicitor shall, within
19	90 days after the seizure of the vehicle:
20	(1) FILE A FORFEITURE petition [the Circuit Court for Baltimore City] IN A COURT OF
21	COMPETENT JURISDICTION, in the name of the City against the vehicle, as
22	designated by make, model, year, and motor or serial number; and
23	(2) at the same time, send copies of the petition by registered or certified mail to the
24	owner and any known secured party.
25	(c) Publication of notice.
26	(1) Within 7 days of the petition's filing, the Solicitor shall publish notice of the seizure
27	and forfeiture proceeding in 1 or more newspapers [published] OF GENERAL
28	CIRCULATION in the City.
29	[§ 40-16. Early retrieval by owner.
30	(a) Appraisal of vehicle.
31	(1) If the owner of the seized vehicle wants to repossess it before the petition is decided,
32	the Clerk of the Circuit Court shall have an appraisal made.

3 3	(2) The appraisal shall be in writing under oath, to the Clerk of the Circuit Court

1	(b) Owner to submit bond.
2 3	(1) When the appraisal is filed, the owner may post a bond, payable to the City, in an amount equal to:
4	(i) all court costs that may accrue; plus
5	(ii) the greater of:
6	(A) the appraised value of the vehicle; or
7	(B) \$500.
8 9	(2) The bond shall have security approved by the Clerk and be conditioned for performance on the final judgment of the Circuit Court.
10	(c) Judgment on bond.
11	If the court directs that the vehicle be forfeited, judgment may be entered against the
12	obligors on the bond, without further or other proceeding, to be discharged by the
13	payment of the appraised value of the vehicle and court costs, on which judgment
14	execution may be issued.]
15	§ 40-17. Order of forfeiture.
16	(b) Disposition of vehicle subject to security interest.
17	(1) The secured party:
18	(I) shall sell the vehicle in a commercially reasonable manner; AND
19 20	(II) MAY NOT SELL THE VEHICLE TO THE OWNER OR OTHER PERSON FROM WHOM IT WAS SEIZED.
21 22	(2) [Any sale ordered under this section must be made for cash and must vest in the purchaser a clear and absolute title to the vehicle.
23	(3)] The proceeds of the sale shall be applied as follows:
24	(i) to the court costs of the forfeiture proceedings;
25 26	(ii) to the balance due to the secured party, including all reasonable costs incident to the sale;
27 28	(iii) to payment of all other expenses of the proceedings for forfeiture, including expenses of seizure, maintenance, or custody; and
29	(iv) to the general funds of the City.

1	(c) Disposition of forfeited vehicle.
2	[Any] A vehicle that has been ordered forfeited to the City may be:
3	(1) sold as provided in City Code Article 31, Subtitle 31, Part 5;
4 5	(2) transferred to a charitable organization for export abroad, as provided in City Code Article 31, § 31-58(c); or
6	(3) destroyed.
7	[(d) Proceeds of bond.
8	The proceeds of any bond posted to regain possession of the vehicle shall be applied as provided for proceeds of sale under subsection (b)(3)(iv) of this section.]
10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
11	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
12	Ordinance.
13	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day
14	after the date it is enacted.
