<u>INTRODUCTION</u> — Special Benefits Districts - Bmore Safe Places - Bmore Safe Places For the purpose of redesignating the City's Public Safety Conservation Area Program as the NeighborWatch Area Program; setting the requirements for neighborhoods to participate in the NeighborWatch Area Program; creating a Bmore Safe Places Board to implement the NeighborWatch Area Program; requiring the Department of Transportation to post signs in designated NeighborWatch Areas; and generally relating to the NeighborWatch Area Program.

<u>PURPOSE/PLANS</u> – Signage. The Department Of Transportation will post at least one sign on each blockface of the area, stating that this block is part of a Neighbor Watch area.

BRIEF HISTORY – N/A

FISCAL IMPACT AND TIME ESTIMATION – Per Block Estimated Cost \$1,972.17.

The following breakdown includes two signs per block, with a sign at each approach end.

Please find that the signage process, including plan review, fabrication, and installation, will need an allotted estimated timeframe of approximately **60 days**.

The process demands approvals of signage and verbiage by Baltimore City Police Department, which is approximated to take one week's time. Upon receipt of design approval by Baltimore City Police Department, two weeks will be allotted for sign fabrication (given the estimated scope of the project). Additionally, DOT Right of Way Division must approve planned locations in the event of any obstruction due to utilities. Right of Way approvals may take up to two weeks; only after approvals may installation begin. Installation per block will take 2 days.
