10	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the	
11	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

14	Subtitle 36. Parking, etc., Fines, Penalties, and Procedures	
15	§ 36-4. \$250 fines.	
16	f(1)} Parking or standing a noncommercial vehicle of more than 20,000 pounds gross	
17	weight or a commercial vehicle of 20,000 pounds or less gross vehicle weight in	
18	violation of § 6-26(b) {"Stopping by residence"} of this article is punishable by a fine	
19	of \$250.	
20	{(2) Obstructing or impeding the free flow of traffic <u>within an intersection or a marked</u>	
21	CROSSWALK OR BY A COMMERCIAL VEHICLE is punishable by a fine of \$250.

4 5 6 7	(2) Parking, stopping, or standing in violation of posted restrictions in any Residential Perm Parking Program Area within the Camden Yards Stadium Complex Area, at any time between 1 hour before the advertised start of a stadium event and 1 hour after the event ends, is punishable by a fine of \$100.		
8 9	(3) Obstructing or impeding the free flow of traffic is punishable by a fine of \$100.		
10 11 12	(3) (1) Parking, stopping, or standing in such a manner as to obstruct or impede the free flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic is punishable by a fine of \$100, subject to the requirements of subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph (3)		
13 14 15	(II) (A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (II), THE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT MAY NOT ISSUE A CITATION FOR THIS OFFENSE UNLESS:		
16 17	(1) It first issues a written warning, ordering the obstruction or impediment to be removed within 15 minutes of the warning; and		
18 19	(2) The impediment or obstruction is not removed within the specified <u>time.</u>		
20 21 22 23	(B) This subparagraph (II) does not apply, and a citation may be issued without a prior warning, on a street marked as a snow emergency route at any time between the hours of 7 a.m and 9:30 a.m. or the hours of 4 p.m. and 6 p.m.		
24 25 26	(III) This paragraph (3) does not apply to an obstruction or impediment within an intersection or a marked crosswalk or by a commercial vehicle, as provided in § 36-4(2) of this subtitle.		
27 28 29	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.		
30 31	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
