Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Chairman Costello called bills 23-0362 and 23-0363 into order together.
- 2. Councilmember Ramos gave opening remarks noting the housing crisis, land bank accountability, and the land banks in Cleveland and Detroit.
- 3. Councilmember Torrance also gave remarks noting the creation of systems that rectify redlining in communities, such as Sandtown-Winchester.
- 4. Deputy Mayor Justin Williams also gave remarks.
- 5. Chairman Costello went over the agency reports with agency representatives.
- 6. Housing Commissioner Alice Kennedy gave a presentation
- 7. Councilmember Stokes noted that there is a lack of transparency on the Land Bank Authority with the community and a lack of collaboration.
- 8. Vice President Middleton noted the City needs extra tools and partnerships.
- 9. DHCD noted they do not see the Land Bank Authority as a new tool but as duplicative, and they are uncertain of its powers. DHCD already has staff working in this area.
- 10. Councilmember Ramos noted the Land Bank Authority would work with DHCD and the community. It should be allowed to do the In-Rem process based on her interpretation.
- 11. Councilmember Ramos asked about DHCD's capacity breakdown and noted the Land Bank Authority would not take way DHCD's powers.
- 12. Councilmember Torrance noted that clarification on the Land Bank Authority and the In Rem foreclosure is needed.
- 13. Councilmember Ramos and Finance discussed the report noting comparisons to other Land Banks. The Office of the Comptroller was also engaged in the discussion.
- 14. Councilmember Stokes asked about a cost analysis, and Finance noted that it would be \$1.7M to \$22M. Finance noted that programs are already in DHCD, and the Land Bank Authority would divert funds from the agency.
- 15. Councilmember Torrance noted that Baltimore has 2 real estate agencies one in DHCD and one in the Comptroller's Officer. There are duplicative efforts throughout the government. He asked how do we collaborate amongst multiple agencies.
- 16. Vice President Middleton noted they constantly pushed homeownership. They're still dragging in progress, but everything new will be a financial risk. She thanked Commissioner Kennedy.
- 17. Various members of the public gave testimony.
- 18. Hearing recessed at 12:55 pm.
- 19. Hearing reconvened at 1:30 pm.
- 20. There were 18 amendments put forth. Vote was taken on the amendments and passed favorably.
- 21. Vote taken; motion passed unfavorable. Hearing concluded.
