**INTRODUCTION** – Repeal - Reisterstown Plaza Transit Station Urban Renewal Area and Plan

**PURPOSE/PLANS** – For the purpose of repealing Ordinance 09-219, which established the Reisterstown Plaza Transit Station Urban Renewal Area and Plan; and providing for a special effective date.

**COMMENTS** – Council Bill 21-0057 seeks to repeal the existing Reisterstown Plaza Transit Station Urban Renewal Area and Plan. This legislation is a companion bill to Council Bill 21-0053, currently in the Economic & Community Development, which looks to rezone 4207 and 4209 Menlo Drive. Though the legislation looks to repeal the Reisterstown Plaza Transit Station Urban Renewal Area and Plan, it is important to note that areas currently designated as Transit Oriented Development Districts will remain in place. In the previous term, this legislation was introduced as Council Bill 20-0610.

**AGENCY/DEPARTMENT POSITION** – The Department of Transportation foresees no direct fiscal or operational impact resulting from the advancement of Council Bill 21-0057.
