10	This subtitle automatically expires on [July 30, 2019,] AUGUST 31, 2020, unless the City
11	Council, after causing an appropriate study to be undertaken, conducting public hearings, and
12	hearing testimonial evidence, finds that the purposes identified in this subtitle have not yet
13	been achieved, in which case this subtitle may be extended for 5 more years.
14	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the Mayor and City Council finds that the
15	existing disparity study remains a valid factual predicate for the Minority and Women's Business
16	Program and provides sufficient legal justification for continuing the Program during the interim
17	extension period enacted by this Ordinance.
18	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
19	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
20	Ordinance.
