

I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 09-0360.

City Streets - Closing – Two Portions of Penn Street

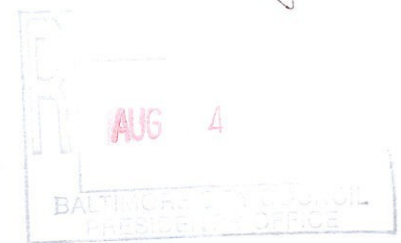
For the purpose of condemning and closing (1) a portion of Penn Street, extending from Lombard Street, North 02/ 49' 40" West 346.42 feet to Redwood Street and (2) a portion of Penn Street at a point on the east side thereof, distant North 02/ 49' 40" West 107.33 feet from the north side of Lombard Street and extending North 02/ 49' 40" West 239.09 feet, as shown on Plat 184-A-23A in the Office of the Department of Public Works; and providing for a special effective date.

The Department of Transportation has reviewed this bill and has no objections to its passage. The bill helps clear the way for the development of certain parcels in the University of Maryland Medical Complex(Shock Trauma). Neither do we have any objection to the technical amendments put forth by the Department of Public Works.
