### SYNOPSIS

City Council Bill 25-0096 is Parking for Disabled Individuals and Helpers – Modifications for the purpose of removing certain permit renewal requirements for an individual with a disability; allowing a certain individual to submit notice to the Department of Transportation that a reserved parking permit is no longer needed; removing certain obsolete language; and generally relating to parking for disabled persons and helpers.

### SUMMARY OF POSITION

The Parking Authority of Baltimore City (PABC) has reviewed the proposed legislation. The proposed bill will simplify the application process and the renewal process associated with reserved residential parking for disabled persons and helpers. The Parking Authority has no objections to the bill as drafted.

### FISCAL IMPACT

The passage of the bill would have little to no fiscal impact as it relates to parking.
