1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 **Baltimore City Landmark List: Public Interiors – the Senator Theatre**

3 FOR the purpose of designating the Senator Theatre, 5904 York Road, as a historical landmark:  
4 public interior.

5 BY adding

6 Article 6 - Historical and Architectural Preservation

7 Section(s) 12A-1, to be under the new subtitle designation, “Subtitle 12A. Landmark List:  
8 Public Interiors - 2000s”

11 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the  
12 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

14 **Article 6. Historical and Architectural Preservation**

15 **SUBTITLE 12A. LANDMARK LIST: PUBLIC INTERIORS - 2000S**

16 **§ 12A-1. SENATOR THEATRE.**

17 SENATOR THEATRE, 5904 YORK ROAD.

18 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance  
19 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior  
20 Ordinance.

21 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day  
22 after the date it is enacted.
