18	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
19	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:
20	<b>Baltimore City Revised Code</b>
21	Article – Zoning
22	Title 4. Residence Districts
23	§ 4-202. Accessory uses.
24	In an R-1 District, accessory uses and structures include the following:
25	(2) Accessory microwave antennas (satellite dishes), as follows:

**EXPLANATION:** CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

1	(i) A mounted satellite dish that:
2 3	(A) is attached to the rear half of the roof of the principal building at least 5 feet beyond the center line of the roof; and
4	(B) has the following dimensions:
5	1. if constructed of solid material, it:
6	A. is 4 feet or less in diameter; and
7 8	B. projects 6 feet or less from the building on which it is mounted; and
9	2. if constructed of expanded aluminum mesh or wire screen, it:
10	A. is 6 feet or less in diameter; and
11 12	B. projects 8 feet or less from the building on which it is mounted.
13	(ii) A free-standing satellite dish that is:
14	(A) mounted on a single stanchion;
15	(B) 6 feet or less in diameter;
16	(C) less than 10 feet high; [and]
17	(D) constructed of expanded aluminum mesh or wire screen; AND
18	(E) LOCATED IN A REAR YARD.
19	(iii) Any accessory satellite dish not exceeding 12 feet in diameter that is located:
20	(A) on the premises of a tavern, regardless of lot size; or
21 22	(B) on the premises one of the following uses, if the use is on lot of at least 7,500 square feet:
23	1. Convalescent, nursing, or rest homes.
24 25	2. Educational and cultural institutions: nonprofit or publicly owned, as specified in § 4-201(4) of this subtitle.
26	3. Hotel and motels.
27	4. Housing for the elderly.
28	5. Medical facilities: nonprofit or publicly owned.

1 2	6. Religious institutions, as specified in § 4-201(6) of this subtitle.
3	7. VFW and American Legion Posts.
4	§ 4-203. Conditional uses — Board approval required.
5	In an R-1 District, conditional uses that require Board approval are as follows:
6	(2) Accessory microwave antennas (satellite dishes), as follows:
7	(i) A mounted satellite dish that:
8 9	(A) is attached to [the front half of the roof of the principal building or to] the rear half of the roof less than 5 feet beyond the center line; and
10	(B) has the following dimensions:
11	1. if constructed of solid material, it:
12	A. is over 4 feet in diameter; or
13 14	B. projects more than 6 feet from the building on which it is mounted; and
15	2. if constructed of expanded aluminum mesh or wire screen, it:
16	A. is over 6 feet in diameter; or
17 18	B. projects more than 8 feet from the building on which it is mounted.
19	(ii) A free-standing satellite dish that is:
20	(A) more than 6 feet in diameter;
21	(B) more than 10 feet high; [or]
22	(C) not constructed of expanded aluminum mesh or wire screen; OR
23	(D) IS LOCATED IN AN INTERIOR SIDE YARD.
24	Title 5. Office-Residence Districts
25	§ 5-203. Conditional uses — Board approval required.
26	In an O-R District, conditional uses that require Board approval are as follows:
27	(2) Accessory microwave antennas (satellite dishes), as follows:

1	(i) A mounted satellite dish that:
2 3	(A) is attached to [the front half of the roof of the principal building or to the rear half of the roof less than 5 feet beyond the center line; and
4	(B) has the following dimensions:
5	1. if constructed of solid material, it:
6	A. is over 4 feet in diameter; or
7 8	B. projects more than 6 feet from the building on which it is mounted; and
9	2. if constructed of expanded aluminum mesh or wire screen, it:
10	A. is over 6 feet in diameter; or
11 12	B. projects more than 8 feet from the building on which it is mounted.
13	(ii) A free-standing satellite dish that is:
14	(A) more than 6 feet in diameter;
15	(B) more than 10 feet high; [or]
16	(C) not constructed of expanded aluminum mesh or wire screen; OR
17	(D) IS LOCATED IN AN INTERIOR SIDE YARD.
18	Title 13. Nonconformance
19	§ 13-617. SATELLITE DISHES IN RESIDENCE AND OFFICE-RESIDENCE DISTRICTS.
20 21 22 23 24	Accessory microwave antennas (satellite dishes) in a Residence or Office-Residence District that have become nonconforming, whether by amendment to this article or by reclassification of a district or property, must be discontinued and cease no later than 6 months after the date on which the use became nonconforming.
25	Title 14. Conditional Uses
26	§ 14-316. Microwave antennas.
27	(a) Required findings.
28 29	For the placement or erection of microwave antennas (satellite dishes), the Board may consider the quality of signal reception but must find, and require as a condition of

1 2	approval, that the antenna will not interfere with the rights of the adjacent and neighboring properties to light, air, and sun.
3	(b) Additional conditions.
4	In addition, the Board may:
5	(1) specify the placement of the antenna; and
6	(2) require screening.
7	(c) Limitations.
8	In no event may the Board allow:
9	(1) ANY MICROWAVE ANTENNA (SATELLITE DISH) TO BE ATTACHED TO THE FRONT
10 11	HALF OF THE PRINCIPAL BUILDING OR PLACED IN A FRONT OR OTHER YARD ADJOINING A STREET; OR
12	(2) IN AN R-1 OR O-R DISTRICT, ANY MICROWAVE ANTENNA (SATELLITE DISH) THAT
13 14	is over $5$ feet in diameter to be placed on any part of the roof of any residential property.
15	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
16 17	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
18	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day
19	after the date it is enacted.
