PRESIDENTS OFFER

This bill increases penalties for illegal waste disposal and establishes liability for the cleanup of illegally disposed materials on City and private property.

Analysis

The primary function of this bill is in the establishment of liability for cleanup of illegally disposed waste. By establishing liability, the City is better able to require individuals to pay for cleanup, a cost now carried by the City.

Fiscal Impact

The Department of Finance anticipates a modest increase in revenue from this source. Based on historical citations, the City would expect to collect an additional \$136,700. However, as a fine increases, illegal behavior generally decreases. The larger fines would most likely result in fewer instances of illegal dumping, thus producing revenue that would fall short of \$136,700.

While the revenue will likely fall short of the estimate below, the purpose of the bill would be fulfilled if less dumping occurred.
