AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Environmental Citations – Work Without Building Permit

FOR the purpose of adding certain Building Code violations to those subject to environmental citations.

BY adding

Article 1 - Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies
Section(s) 40-14(e)(5a)
Baltimore City Code
(Edition 2000)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 1. Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies

Subtitle 40. Environmental Control Board

§ 40-14. Violations to which subtitle applies.

(e) *Provisions and penalties enumerated.*

(5A) ***BUILDING, FIRE, AND RELATED CODES –
BUILDING CODE***

§ 113.14. WORK WITHOUT PERMIT \$500
