Re: Council Bill 17-0095 {"Public Ethics Law - City Board of Liquor License Commissioners - Conformance to New State Law"}

You have referred Council Bill 17-0095 to the Ethics Board for its report and comments. As indicated in the Title to Council Bill 17-0095, the bill's purpose is to:

amen[d] the Baltimore City Public Ethics Law to comply with Chapter 519, 2017 Acts of the General Assembly, which subjects the members and employees of ... the Baltimore City Board of Liquor License Commissioners ... to the restrictions and requirements of the Maryland Public Ethics Law

Chapter 519 amends the Maryland Public Ethics Law, effective October 1, 2017, to subject virtually *all* local liquor control boards and local boards of liquor license commissioners, including the Baltimore City Board of Liquor License Commissioners, to the Maryland Public Ethics Law, subject to exclusive ethics oversight by the State Ethics Commission. (A copy of Chapter 519 is attached.) Thus, as of October 1, 2017, the City Public Ethics Law no longer will have any applicability to or jurisdiction over the City Board of Liquor License Commissioners.

Council Bill 17-0095, in turn, is purely corrective: It would simply amend the City Public Ethics Law, also effective October 1, 2017, to delete that law's then-to-be obsolete references to the City Board of Liquor License Commissioner, its officers and employees.

The Ethics Board respectively requests your consideration and approval of this bill.
