Re: City Council Bill 24-0593 – Revenue Obligations – Water Projects – Repeal and Replace

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 24-0593 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would repeal and replace Ordinance 24-362 (City Council Bill 24-0482) enacted in January 2024 due to clerical errors in the prior Ordinance.

Revenue bonds and obligations are authorized by Section (50) of Article II of the City Charter, which contains the City's home rule powers enacted by the General Assembly. *See, e.g., Kimball-Tyler Co. v. Baltimore*, 214 Md. 86, 94 (1957); 87 Op. Atty Gen. Md. 187, 191, n. 8 (2002). The debt is secured by revenues "arising in connection with the property, facilities, developments and improvements whose financing is undertaken," which can include refunding obligations. City Charter, Art. II, § (50)(a).

The Charter permits the City to authorize this funding by enactment of an ordinance that can provide any details about the bonds, including issuance and sale, as well as empowering the Board of Finance to permit or carry out any functions related to the bonds. City Charter, Art. II, (50)(b). Since this bill complies with these requirements, the Law Department can approve it for form and legal sufficiency.
