**AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING**

**Baltimore City Landmark List – Appold-Faust Building**

FOR the purpose of designating the Appold-Faust Building, 307-309 West Baltimore Street, as a historical landmark.

BY adding

Article 6 - Historical and Architectural Preservation  
Section(s) 13-10  
Baltimore City Code  
(Edition 2000)

**SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

**Baltimore City Code**

**Article 6. Historical and Architectural Preservation**

**Subtitle 13. Landmark List - 2010s**

**§ 13.10. APPOLD-FAUST BUILDING.**

APPOLD-FAUST BUILDING, 307-309 WEST BALTIMORE STREET.

**SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

**SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
