9	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the	
10	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:	
11	Baltimore City Code	
12	Article 31. Transit and Traffic	
13	Subtitle 6. Parking, Standing, and Stopping Regulations	
14	§ 6-26. Commercial vehicles.	
15	(a) "Commercial vehicle" limited.	
16	In this section, "commercial vehicle" does not include a vehicle that:	
17	(1) has a maximum gross vehicle weight of less than 7,000 pounds or a	
18	manufacturer's rated capacity of 3/4 -ton;	
19	(2) has no commercial advertising on the exterior of the body or on any attached	
20	equipment compartments, or apparatus;

1	(3) is not visibly loaded with supplies or equipment; and	
2	(4) is designed to carry [10] 15 or fewer passengers.	
3	(b) Stopping by residence.	
4	(1) Except as otherwise specified in this section, no vehicle that exceeds 20,000 pounds	
5	gross vehicle weight and no commercial vehicle may park, stand, or stop longer than	
6	1 hour continuously on any street, lane, or alley in front of or adjacent to any property	
7	used or intended to be used as a residence.	
8	(2) This subsection does not apply to a commercial vehicle that is parked for the purpose	
9	of doing any public or private work for or on behalf of any person located within a	
0	radius of 1 block from the property used or intended to be used as a residence.	
1	(c) Nighttime hours.	
2	Except as otherwise specified in this section, no vehicle that exceeds 20,000 pounds	
3	gross vehicle weight and no commercial vehicle may park, stand, or stop longer than 1	
4	hour continuously between the hours of 1 a.m. and 7 a.m. on any street, lane, or alley of	
5	the City.	
6	(d) Exceptions.	
17	This section does not apply to:	
8	(1) vehicles of the Police Department or the Fire Department; or	
9	(2) emergency vehicles belonging to the City or to any public utility.	
20	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance	
21	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior	
22	Ordinance.	
23	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day	
24	after the date it is enacted.
