8 9	The additions, deletions, amendments, and other modifications adopted by the City are as follows:
10	Section 306 Exterior Sanitary Maintenance – Trash, Garbage, and Debris
11	306.6 Storage receptacles – Specifications and maintenance.

13	306.6.1.1 General. Each storage receptacle must:
14 15	 be made of metal or some other durable material approved by the Code Official,
16	2. be watertight, with tight-fitting covers and handles, and
