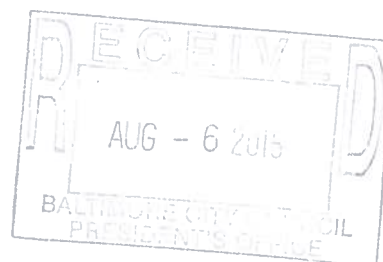
As requested, The Department of Real Estate has reviewed the subject bill created for the purpose of repealing deadlines by which a qualified person must apply for an arts and entertainment property tax credit or register for an arts and entertainment admissions and amusement tax exemption; conforming certain obsolete statutory references to their current counterparts; providing for a special effective date; and generally relating to tax credits and tax exemptions in Arts and Entertainment Districts.

As this bill affects only situations relative to Article 28, Subtitle 10-14, and since there has been no new development or revenue generated, the Real Estate Department takes no position on City Council Bill 13-0402 and defers to the Department of Finance.
