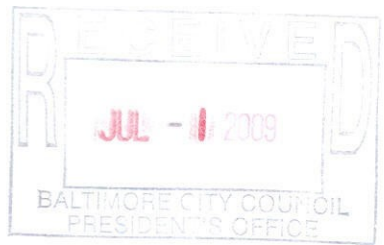

City Council Bill #09-0345 has been introduced for the purpose of merging the Public Safety conservation Area Advisory Board and the Baltimore Urban Lighting Board (BULB) into a new, reconstituted board; reviving the Public Safety Conservation Area Program; correcting, clarifying, and conforming related provisions; and generally relating to promoting a crime-free environment in neighborhoods.

This Bill, if passed, would modify Article 14 Special Benefits Districts, Sections 16-1 through 16-8 of the Baltimore City Code. This Bill, if passed, will reactivate the Public Safety Conservation Area program and reestablish the Baltimore Urban Lighting Board (BULB) to work with communities particularly in the area of public improvements related to lighting and trimming of greenery. Additionally, the Bill sets forth the composition of the Board and the procedures for application, implementation and monitoring of projects.

The Department of Finance has no objection to the passage of Council Bill #09-0345.
