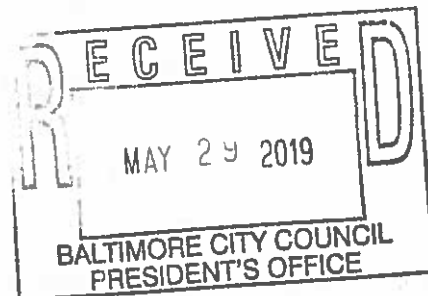
City Council Bill #19-0391 was created for the purpose of providing a supplementary State fund operating appropriation in the amount of \$2,214,357 to the Police Department, Service 621: Administration and Information Technology, to provide funding to support information technology upgrades, and providing for a special effective date.

This bill will enable expenditure of an unanticipated state grant that will fund critical improvements to information technology, as part of the Police Department's efforts to modernize and meet requirements of the Consent Decree with the U.S. Department of Justice.

This state fund appropriation in the total amount of \$2,214,357 will go to Service 621: Administration and Technology. The source of funds is a Crime Reduction grant from the state, which was authorized for acceptance by the Board of Estimates on January 23, 2019. During development of the Fiscal 2019 budget, the Police Department did not anticipate receiving these funds to support information technology upgrades, so a supplemental appropriation is necessary to expend the state grant.

The Department of Finance supports passage of Council Bill #19-0391.

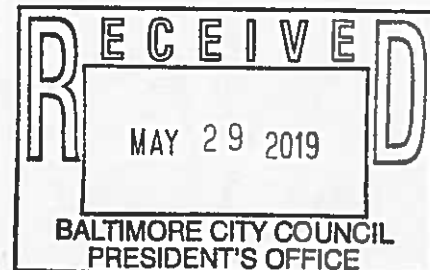
Dear President and Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 19-0391 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill provides for a Supplementary State Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$2,214,357 to the Police Department - Service 621 (Administration and Information Technology), to provide funding to support information technology upgrades in order to modernize the Department and meet the requirements of the Consent Decree with the U.S. Department of Justice. The bill shall take effect on the date of its enactment.

The Baltimore City Charter establishes procedures for appropriating funds not anticipated at the time that the budget was enacted. Art. VI, Sec. 8 permits such supplementary appropriations to be made available to the appropriate municipal agency when funds become available from public or private sources that could not be expected with reasonable certainty at the time of the formulation of the Ordinance of Estimates. The supplementary appropriation must be recommended by Board of Estimates and must be approved by the Mayor and City Council via ordinance, which may only encompass a "single program, purpose, activity or project." See Sec. 8(c). The bill provides that the source of revenue is funds from Governor's Office of Crime Control Prevention for the Crime Reduction Project in excess of the revenue relied upon by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the Budget for Fiscal Year 2019

The bill comports with the requirements of the Charter. The Law Department, therefore, approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.

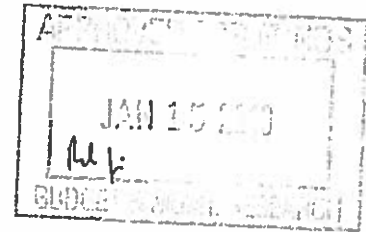

BACKGROUND AND EXPLANATION:

The Crime Reduction grant (total award of \$9,180,112) will be used to assist the Baltimore Police Department in its continued pursuit to strengthen communities and eliminate violent crime. The program will deploy police officers to walk foot patrol throughout communities to bolster public trust, work together with community advocates, resolve neighborhood problems, and improve public safety.

The Baltimore Police Department anticipated receiving this grant funding to support police officers and detectives in Fiscal 2019, and accordingly budgeted \$6,965,755 in Service 622: Police Patrol, Service 624: Target Violent Criminals, and Service 637: Special Operations.

The Baltimore Police Department did not anticipate also receiving \$2,214,357 of grant funding to support information technology upgrades. Therefore, the Board of Estimates is requested to approve a supplemental appropriation for that amount. Upgrading information technology is a critical step in modernizing the Department and meeting requirements of the Consent Decree with the U.S. Department of Justice.
