RE: City Council Bill 08-0070 - "Padlock Law" - Scope

Dear President and Members

You have requested the advice of the Law Department regarding City Council Bill 08-0070. The Bill will amend Article 19, Subtitle 43-1 of the City Code, alternatively known as the "Padlock Law," to provide a threshold in the definition of a public nuisance under the subtitle and to describe what constitutes prima facie evidence of that threshold being met.

On December 3, 2007, the City Council passed and the Mayor signed into law City Council Bill 07-0624, which clarified and expanded the provisions constituting a public nuisance and generally overhauled the nuisance abatement procedures. Among other changes, the scope of nuisance abatement was expanded to include locations that promote crimes of violence and activities associated with violent crime, such as gang activity and illegal gun possession. This Bill, 08-0070, supplements Bill 07-0624 by further delineating the definition of a nuisance and the enforcement procedures. Specifically, the Bill establishes a threshold of two or more separate occasions of a prohibited use within a 24-month period, before abatement proceedings may be initiated. The Bill also specifies that a police report constitutes prima facie evidence of a second occasion.

City Council Bill 08-0070 is consistent with the authority of the City Council. The Law Department, therefore, approves the City Council Bill 08-0070 for form and legal sufficiency.
