2	"Dangerous knife" means any:
3	(i) Bowie knife;
4	(ii) dirk knife;
5	(iii) gravity knife;
6	(iv) shooting knife, as described in State Criminal Law Article § 4-105;
7	(v) star knife, as defined in State Criminal Law Article § 4-101;
8	(vi) straight razor;
9 10	(vii) switchblade knife, as described in § 59-22 of this subtitle or in State Criminal Law Article § 4-105; or
11	(viii) any knife with a blade that is longer than 3 inches.

13 14	"Person" means any individual, partnership, firm, association, corporation, limited liability company, or other entity of any kind.
15	(b) Prohibited transfer, etc., to individuals under 21.
16 17 18	No person may sell, give, or otherwise transfer a dangerous knife to, or permit the use or possession of a dangerous knife by, any individual that the person knows or has reasonable cause to believe is under the age of 21.
19	(C) PROHIBITED COMMERCIAL DISPLAY TO MINORS.
20	(1) PLACEMENT IN WINDOWS PROHIBITED.
