
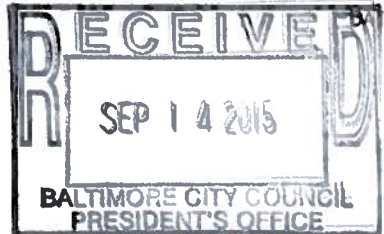

At its regular meeting of September 9, 2015, the Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation considered City Council Bill #15-0509, for the purpose designating Eastern Avenue Pumping Station, 751 Eastern Avenue, as a historical landmark.

In its consideration of this Bill, the Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation reviewed the attached staff report which recommended approval and support of City Council Bill #15-0509 and adopted the following resolution (11 members being present, 11 in favor):  
to approve the staff recommendation that the proposed designation meets Guideline 5.1 *Criteria for Designating Districts and Landmarks* as the Eastern Avenue Pumping Station (751 Eastern Avenue) meets Criterion 1 for its association with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of Baltimore history; Criterion 3 for its embodiment of the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; and Criterion 4 for its ability to yield information important in Baltimore prehistory or history.
