## **Introduction**

The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 24-0545 Tax Credits - Historic Properties - Application Extension for the purpose of extending the period within which applications may be accepted for the historic improvement tax credit and providing for a special effective date.

If enacted, City Council Bill 24-0545 would extend the deadline for applications on the historic improvement tax credit until December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2027. In 2023 the Council approved an extension to the application's current deadline of August 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024. If approved, this legislation will become effective on the day of its enactment.

## **DHCD** Analysis

CHAP Tax Credits incentivize homeowners and small businesses to rehabilitate buildings in historic neighborhoods. From rowhomes to the adaptive reuse of commercial properties, such tax credits provide for the preservation of historically significant buildings in the City of Baltimore.

The Historic Tax Credit has been an important neighborhood revitalization tool and particularly beneficial for rehabbing vacant buildings. Groups such as Black Women Build, ReBuild Metro, Parity Homes, and Druid Heights CDC have used the credit to rehab vacant properties in East and West Baltimore.
