17	§ 17-15. TERM; RENEWAL; Fees.
18	(A) TERM.
19	Unless renewed, a license expires annually on June 30.
20	(B) Renewal.
21 22	(1) To renew a license, the licensee must apply no less than $30\mathrm{days}$ nor more than $60\mathrm{days}$ before the license expires.

18	(2) Other merchandise.
19	The annual fee for a license to sell merchandise other than food products is \$75.
20	(d) [(b)] FEES – Proration.
21 22	If the license is issued after June 30 of any calendar year, the initial license fee is $\frac{1}{2}$ the annual fee.
23	§ 17-31. Revocations, [and] suspensions, AND REFUSALS TO RENEW.
24	(a) Authorized suspension, [or] revocation, OR DENIAL.
25 26	The Board may suspend, [or] revoke, OR REFUSE TO RENEW a license if the licensee violates any provision of:
27	(1) this subtitle;
28	(2) the rules and regulations adopted under this subtitle; or
29	(3) any other applicable law of the State or City.

1	§ 17-32. Administrative appeals.
2	(a) Right of appeal.
3	An aggrieved party may appeal to the Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals:
4	(1) the denial, suspension, or revocation of OR REFUSAL TO RENEW a license; or
5	(2) any other decision or ruling by the Board of Licenses.
6 7 8	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
9 10	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
