and a 10-Foot Alley

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 18-0206 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would allow the City to condemn and open Eastbourne Avenue and a 10-Foot Alley, which it no longer needs.

Section (34) of Article II of the City Charter grants the Mayor and City Council the power to "construct, open, extend, widen, straighten or close streets, bridges, tunnels or approaches to them and other public ways of every kind within the bounds of the City." Section 116(b)(2) of Article VII of the City Charter requires the Department of Transportation to prepare all ordinances for the opening and closing of streets.

The Department of Transportation prepared the ordinance but notes that there was a typographical error: "284 feet" should be changed to "184 feet" in every instance. Subject to this amendment, the Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
