



Students feel safe at this school








STUDENT WITHDRAWALS


YTD SUSPENSIONS & SERIOUS OFFENSES

Suspensions (as of 5/27/09):

(3,024 decrease short-term, 659 decrease long-term) Overall decrease of 3,683 suspensions from FY07-08

Serious Offenses:

- compared to the same time last year. Serious offenses resulting in suspensions are down 15%
- 2,729). compared to the same time last year (2,489 compared to School Police serious offenses are down by 240 incidents



GREAT KIDS OUR CRITICAL DATA: GANG ACTIVITY IN SCHOOLS

City Schools has been successful in minimizing gang activities in schools (as of 5/27/09):

- 61 gang related incidents YTD in SY07-08.








GREAT KIDS OUR RESPONSE:


