

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 24-0576 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would allow the City to sell its interest in 1400 Leadenhall Street, declaring it no longer needed for public use.

Section 5(b) of Article V of the City Charter grants the Department of Real Estate in the Comptroller's Office the power to sell any interest in property that the Mayor and City Council deems by ordinance no longer needed for public use, if that sale is approved by the Board of Estimates.

The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 24-0596 Sale of Property - 1400 Leadenhall Street for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain property that is located at 1400 Leadenhall Street (Block 0987, Lot 003) and is no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

#### **SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION**

The Office of Equity & Civil Rights (OECR) has reviewed and is herein reporting on City Council Bill 24-0596 – *Sale of Property - 1400 Leadenhall Street*. This is a property sale ordinance bill.

The bill seeks to accomplish the following:

- Authorize the sale of the property located at 1400 Leadenhall Street.
- Provide that the deed only be transferred after the approval of the City Solicitor.
- Provide an effective date for the ordinance of the day the bill is enacted.

The bill accomplishes this under the authority granted to the Mayor and Baltimore City Council by Article V - Comptroller, Section 5(b) of the Baltimore City Charter.

#### **ANALYSIS**

City Council Bill 24-0596 intends to sell the city-owned property located at 1400 Leadenhall Street, which is no longer needed for public use. The property is located in an industrial zoning area and was once operated by the Department of Transportation's Conduit Division before being added to the surplus inventory in 2024. After its surplus, the property was transferred to the Baltimore Development Corporation (BDC) from the Department of Real Estate, which has approved the sale of the property if the bill is passed. The BDC plans to sell the property in its existing state and under existing zoning restrictions.

Upon Council Bill 24-0596's passage, the BDC intends to engage in a formal disposition process for the property in which they will publicly solicit proposals for the purchase and reuse of the site

by a private, non-City of Baltimore affiliated, entity. The selected proposal will go through approval by the BDC Board of Directors and then be presented to the Board of Estimates for final approval of the sale.

#### **CONCLUSION**

The Office of Equity & Civil Rights discerns no inequity in the intent of the property sale on the basis that the property no longer being of use to the City of Baltimore or its residents. However, given that a buyer for the property has not yet been identified, the OECR cannot comment on the potential equity impacts of change in ownership/usage and, as such, makes **no recommendation** on City Council Bill 24-0596.

#### Introduction

For the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain property that is located at 1400 Leadenhall Street (Block 0987, Lot 003) and is no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

#### **DOT Analysis**

Council Bill 24-0596 will serve to sell the Department of Transportation property known as 1400 Leadenhall Street. In the past, the property served as the center of Conduit Division operations before its relocation to the new Inverness location. Since then, the property has seen some use as a staging location for Department work. The Department reviewed the need for this property at the request of the Administration and determined the property to be of limited usefulness, therefore declaring it surplus. The Department of Real Estate concurred with this finding through their independent review. At present, the structure on site is in relatively poor condition and may need to be rehabilitated or demolished before the property is repurposed.

#### Conclusion

The Department no longer needs the property known as 1400 Leadenhall Street and therefore has no objection the passage of Council Bill 24-0596.

The Department of Real Estate is responding to the request for a report on City Council bill 24-0596 Sale of Property – 1400 Leadenhall Street, which is for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain property that is located at 1400 Leadenhall Street (Block 0987, Lot 003) and is no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

#### Background

The property at 1400 Leadenhall was the site of a former Department of Transportation (DOT) Conduit Division. The property was surplussed by (DOT) earlier this year and was initially assigned to the Department of Real Estate (DORE) for disposal. In June of this year, the DORE transferred the property to Baltimore Development Corporation (BDC) to facilitate the reuse of this industrial site. BDC will engage in a formal disposition process for the property and will publicly solicit proposals for the purchase and reuse of the site by a private user.

#### **Ordinance**

A City ordinance is necessary to authorize the sale of 1400 Leadenhall Street.
