City Council Bill 11-0767- Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals -

Public Hearings

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 11-0767. The bill would modify three sections of Zoning Code concerning the conduct of hearings before the Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals ("BMZA"). First, the bill would require that the BMZA add to its minutes the findings of fact and decision on each question considered. Second, the bill would require the "applicant, appellant or other person initiating the hearing" before the BMZA to place a notice giving the time, place and purpose of the hearing on "the subject property" 45 days before the hearing. Third, the bill would require the BMZA to have one hearing a month be scheduled to begin after 5pm. Fourth, the bill would require a BMZA member to be physically present to participate in a hearing. Fifth, the bill would amend the statute to state the current requirement that all BMZA voting sessions be open to the public. Finally, the bill would prevent a BMZA member from voting on a matter unless that member was physically present at the hearing on the matter and is physically present at the voting session.

The Law Department defers to the BMZA for the practical impact of these proposed changes. The Law Department approves this bill for form and legal sufficiency.
