Dear Mr. President and City Council Members:

On behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Employees' Retirement System ("ERS"), I hereby submit the following response to City Council Bill 15-0219R (the "Resolution").

The Resolution requests that the Department of Finance, the ERS and the Labor Commissioner report to the City Council regarding certain changes that have been recently made to the City of Baltimore Deferred Compensation Plan ("DCP"). Those changes include: changing investment options to align generally with the investment options under the City's Retirement Savings Plan; changing the default investment option from a target date fund to a managed account; and allowing employees of the Baltimore City Public School System to participate in the DCP.

At its April 16, 2015 meeting, the ERS Board voted to take no position on the Resolution because the ERS Board has no jurisdiction over the DCP (which is administered by a separate Board of Trustees) and because none of the changes made to the DCP have any impact on the ERS.
