



**Council Bill 06-0326**

1 has the support of the City’s Human Services Sub-Cabinet agencies that provide services to older  
2 adults, including the Departments of Recreation and Parks, Health, Housing and Community  
3 Development, Social Services, Planning, Police, and Transportation, and with the Mayor’s  
4 Offices of Children, Youth and Families, Neighborhoods, Community Investments, and  
5 Employment Development. Other City and governmental agencies supporting the Center are the  
6 Baltimore Area Convention and Visitors Association, Baltimore City Public Schools, the  
7 Community Relations Commission, and the Mayor and City Council.

8 The Center’s approach to urban aging issues will emphasize strategies that have an impact on  
9 public policy, particularly funding; are evidence-based and multi disciplinary; emphasize the  
10 potential of technology to assist the elderly; and create Statewide and national networks of  
11 advocates and planners for the urban elderly.

12 **SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the  
13 City of Baltimore supports the Baltimore City Commission on Aging and Retirement Education  
14 (CARE) in its efforts to design, develop, and implement its initiative to create a “Center for  
15 Urban Aging Services and Research Policy Development” aimed at improving the quality of life  
16 for older adults in Baltimore and urban America.

17 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the  
18 Mayor; the Mayor’s Legislative Liaison to the City Council; Directors of the Baltimore City  
19 Department of Recreation and Parks, the Baltimore City Department of Health, the Baltimore  
20 City Department of Planning, the Baltimore City Department of Housing and Community  
21 Development, the Baltimore City Department of Social Services, the Baltimore City Police  
22 Department, the Baltimore City Department of Transportation; the Mayor’s Offices of Children,  
23 Youth and Families, Neighborhoods, Community Investments, Employment Development; the  
24 Baltimore Area Convention and Visitors Association; Baltimore City Public Schools; and the  
25 Community Relations Commission.

26 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That this Resolution takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup>  
27 day after the date it is enacted.
