City Council Bill 19-0344 - Licensing of Rental Dwellings Re:

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 19-0344 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would require the Housing Commissioner to provide certain alternative methods for applying for a new or renewal rental dwelling license and amend the requirements for a renewal license inspection to except a dwelling unit in a 1 or 2 family dwelling under certain conditions and provides for a special effective date.

Under Article II, Section 17 of the Baltimore City Charter, the City has the general power to regulate all businesses within its jurisdiction. This regulation is an exercise of the City's police powers found in Article II, Section 27 of the City Charter. Police powers can be legitimately exercised when the regulations are rationally related to preserving the public health, safety, morals or general welfare of the public. See City Charter, Article II, Section 47. When such justification is present, the City is entitled to "great deference" in determining how it addresses its problems. New Orleans v. Dukes, 427 U.S. 297, 303-304 (U.S. 1976). This is an exercise of that licensing and regulatory authority.

The Law Department recommends clarifying the language in §5-7 (a)(2) by deleting "OR MAY BE" and "BUT WITHOUT THE NEED FOR THE OTHERWISE 3rd PARTY HOME INSPECTION." A suggested amendment is attached.

The Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
